Catholic Daughters of the America's support white ribbons against pornography (WRAP). This year October 26 through November 2 has been designated as WRAP week. White ribbons were handed out last Sunday in all the Minot parishes in the campaign against pornography. Pornography is a growing problem and is related to sex crimes against children and adults. We need to remain focused in our actions and prayers against pornography. Obscenity crimes ruin marriages, morally corrupt children and undermine the right of all Americans to live in a decent society.

LEGAL ANALYSIS:

WILL MEASURE #1 AFFECT ADVANCE DIRECTIVES AND END-OF-LIFE CARE?

There have been claims and concerns that passage of Measure #1 will impact advance directives and end-of-life care decisions. These claims appear to have no legal justification. The information and discussion below was provided by state and national legal, ethics, and guardianship resource persons.

(1) Measure #1 Cannot Negate Federal Rights Regarding Health Care Directives and End-Of-Life Care: Both the U.S. Supreme Court, and U.S. Congress Guarantee These Rights

The right of all citizens to determine their own health care, as well as the difference between killing and natural death, is recognized by the United States Supreme Court. (See, *Cruzan v. Director, Mo. Dept. of Health*, 497 U. S. 261, 278 (1990); *Vacco v. Quill*, 521 U.S. 793 (1997)).

The right to execute advance directives, and the right to refuse medical treatment, also both are protected by a federal law, the Patient Self-Determination Act (see summary below), which was implemented in all states, including North Dakota, in 1991.

The Patient Self-Determination Act (PSDA) was passed by the [United States Congress](#) in 1990 as an amendment to the [Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1990](#)

• Patient rights, required by the PSDA, include:

- 1. The right to facilitate their own health care decisions**
- 2. The right to accept or refuse medical treatment**
- 3. The right to make an advance health care directive**

(2) The North Dakota Supreme Court, and ND State Laws, Explicitly Recognize the Right to Use Advance Directives and Other Provisions Affecting End-of-Life Care

The ND Supreme Court has recognized a patient's right to direct their own health care as "fundamental" & "well-established." *State ex rel. Schuetzle v. Vogel*, 537 N.W.2d 358 (N.D. 1995) at 360.

North Dakota Century Code section 23-06.5-01 states: "Every competent adult has the right and responsibility to make the decisions relating to the adult's own health care, including the decision to have health care provided, withheld, or withdrawn." Chapter 23-6.5 of the Code explicitly authorizes the use of "health care directives" that either give health care instructions, appoint someone to make those decisions for the patient, or both.

Passage of Measure #1 would not repeal any of these laws. Only the state legislature could repeal these legal/statutory provisions.

(3) Measure #1 Would Not Repeal Any Current State Laws

The North Dakota Supreme Court has held that **amendments to the state constitution cannot implicitly repeal a state law/statute** unless the amendment expressly states that it is self-executing so that no further action by the legislature would be necessary or the amendment is in such direct and specific conflict with the statute so as to create "invincible repugnancy." *Agnew v. Schneider*, 253 N.W.2d 184 (N.D. 1977)

Measure #1 does not reference any existing laws/statutes, so it would not repeal any current state laws.
