We had over 110 people who attended, there were many questions asked and answered. We hope this information will give everyone a clear idea of what the next steps will be in this process.

Veteran's Day has its roots in what was called Armistice Day, the day when a peace agreement was signed with Germany ending World War I. Armistice Day was established with a proclamation by President Woodrow Wilson which reads in part: "Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations." On June 1, 1954, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day to honor all U.S. veterans.

On Veterans Day this year, let us remember and honor those men and women who gave of themselves, and let us continue to pray for our men and women currently serving in the military.

God of mercy we ask for blessings on all those who have served their country in the armed forces.

We ask for healing for the veterans who have been wounded,

in the thousands, who are coming home from Iraq and Afghanistan
with injured bodies and traumatized spirits.

Bring solace to them, O Lord. May we pray for them when they cannot pray.
