
SAINT OF THE WEEK:

ST PIO OF PIETRELcina

SEPTEMBER 23RD

Born in 1887 in southern Italy, Saint Pio grew up in a family of farmers. At age 15, he joined the Capuchin order and was ordained in 1910.

On September 20, 1918, he had a vision of Jesus in the friary which ended with Pio receiving the stigmata in his hands, feet and side. Doctors and Church authorities examined him and questioned the authenticity of the stigmata. Padre Pio was not permitted to celebrate Mass publicly or hear confessions. This was soon reversed but he rarely left the friary. Busloads of people soon began to see him and he spent long hours with them in the confessional. He saw Jesus in all the sick and suffering and many reported cures through his intercessory prayers. His life testified that difficulties and sorrows, if accepted with love, transforms us into a journey of holiness toward a greater good known intimately by Our Lord.



WEEKLY MESSAGE FROM DEACON ROB ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

As a nation built upon the concept of the “American Dream”, we are taught that anything is possible if you work hard. Daily, we are bombarded by propaganda that asks us to focus on ourselves. We are taught that we deserve and can acquire whatever our neighbor has. We are encouraged to surpass out neighbors in possessions, pride and pleasure. We are the “ME” generation. The focus on self is deeply ingrained into our psyche. This is contrary to the Lord’s message for us, today. In fact, it is in juxtaposition to today’s Gospel that teaches humility, service and love.

The first reading from the Book of Wisdom is presented for two reasons. First, in this reading, the wicked discuss and ridicule the just person. Their speech clearly indicates that they believe whatever they do is justified as long as God does not take direct action to intervene. Furthermore, they are their own “ME” generation. Using this approach, the wicked and foolish person deny the involvement of God in their world. This denial creates an unaccountability for their actions making it convenient for them to create their own “right or wrong” and “true or false” mentality. Secondly, this passage is clearly a harbinger that prefigures the relationship that exists between Jesus and the authorities during the Messiah’s lifetime. The Messiah’s passion is vividly predicted in order to show the final vindication that God will give him.

In the Letter of Saint James, our second reading, the ways of the Roman world are put in juxtaposition to the Christian calling. During this imperial period of Roman history, success and prosperity was evident in the corruption of the patrician class. Through flattery, treachery, greed, oppression and extortion the elite few trampled over the many—plebian, barbarian and slave classes. The elite believed themselves to be the determiners of “right” and “wrong” as they denied their own accountability. James reminded the Christians that true Wisdom comes from God and that failure to follow His covenant was the reason that evil existed. Saint



James lists that true wisdom was pure, peaceable gentle, compliant and merciful. It was these qualities that would bear peace and true happiness. To the early Christians, rejection of the Roman way combined with imitating Christ in self-sacrifice and generosity would usher in the new Kingdom of God. This kingdom would transform all creation into a perfect world where Good triumphs over Evil.

Today’s Gospel according to Mark has Jesus explaining the Messianic role to his disciples. Christ reveals the role of the Messiah. This role is completely opposite what his apostles are expecting. The Lord carefully describes the horror he is about to experience – his arrest, flogging and crucifixion. Despite his instruction, the apostles continue to argue over who will be first in the New Israel. The Scripture clearly indicates that they have not accepted this different role of the Messiah. They still look at Christ with the traditional human expectation. Ultimately, Jesus uses a child to relay God’s intent. Christ tells them that whoever receives one child receives me and whoever receives me receives the One who sent me. Since children had absolutely no rights in Roman times, Christ was illustrating that the selfishness and egotism of the Roman world was worthless. God was to be found in the powerless and impoverished. In essence, only by rejecting pride, possessions and power can true happiness and Divine love be found.

The Divine message given to us, today, is that we must follow our Christian calling. It is up to us to reject the messages that bombard us daily. When our “Roman World” tells us that success is measured by power, pride and possessions one has, we ultimately must focus our attention on the crucified Lord who, being the Creator of all, found Himself naked and nailed to a cross. Holy Mother the Church reminds us that this Divine Example did not end in shame; rather, He rose triumphantly over those who would destroy Him. The road has been travelled and way marked; however, it is up to us to follow.
