Reflection - Called by God

Today's scriptures invite us to listen to two calls. The first is the call issued by the LORD to the prophet Amos, the "shepherd and a dresser of sycamores" (Amos 7:14). The second is the call the Lord Jesus issued to the Twelve, whom he sent out "two by two" (Mark 6:7). These faithful people responded to the call, prophesying and preaching to the people to whom they had been sent. Each of us received a call when we were baptized. The second reading invites us to ponder that call as we are reminded that we are chosen in Christ and that, in love, God "destined us for adoption" (Ephesians 1:5). As adopted daughters and sons of God we are called to bring the presence of Christ into our marriages, families, schools, and places of work. Let us be inspired today to say yes to the call we hear once again through God's living word.

Servant of God - Julia Greenley

On the streets of post-Civil War Denver, Julia Greeley was unmistakable as she stood at doorsteps of poor families in

the middle of the night, pulling a red wagon behind her and wearing a floppy black hat. Because the former slave lost an eye as a child when she was whipped by a slave master in Hannibal, Mo., some people in Denver knew her as one-eyed Julia. But most called her an angel of charity. She brought food, coal and clothing, sometimes even hauling mattresses on her back to help families in need. Working as a housekeeper for white families, Greeley, a devout Catholic, gave away much of what she earned to the poor. By the time she died on June 7, 1918 she was so beloved in Denver that wealthy families bought her a grave. Hundreds of people, black and white, poor and rich, attended her funeral at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church, which was covered in newspapers as far as New York. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops gave the go-ahead to open the cause for Greeley's canonization process in 2016, which formally happened in December 2016. An important cut-off is approaching. Before being selected for diaconate formation, a man has to complete the two-year Lay Ecclesial Ministry program offered by the diocese. We are happy to announce that the diocese of Charlotte has partnered with the Catholic Education Center to now offer in-person Basic Certification programs, in addition to the online Basic Certification, at no cost for the 2018-2019 academic year.

On August 16 & 17, 2018, the Office of Faith Formation and the Catholic Education Center will host its first onsite Basic Certification at the Catholic Conference Center in Hickory. The two day training event will cover all ten hours needed to achieve Basic Certification.
