John Henry Newman was a key influencer of Vatican II

How does the church determine what is true and what is false development of doctrine? Three of Newman's seven criteria are:

- **Preservation of type** – The development has to preserve the essential form and structure of what came before.
- **Conservative action upon its past** – Any development cannot reverse or contradict what came before.
- **Power of Assimilation** – Taking into the idea of what is best for its further development and understanding.

DOCUMENT SHREDDING EVENT: The Church will once again sponsor Document Shredding for Earth Day weekend. Eggleston Services will provide secure bins for parishioners' deposit of paper documents as in the past. The bins will be available between April 22 and April 27.

HEARING ASSISTANCE DURING MASS: The Church will have a temporary Hearing Loop installed between March 9 and March 19. The loop is being installed as part of a Faith Inclusion Network Conference at our Church on March 10. The contractor providing the Loop has graciously agreed to leave it in place until March 19, which will allow us to test it for two weekends. If you wear a hearing aid, you should be sure your audiologist has it set to react with a hearing loop. Once this is done, all you have to do is sit in the area of the hearing loop and all sound coming through the sound system will be sent to your hearing aid, but exclusive of surrounding sound that is normally heard. We are interested in your feedback, since hearing loop technology is included in the upcoming sound renovations in our Worship Space. Contact the ushers on weekend services to learn what areas of our Worship Space will be covered by the temporary loop, and the Church Staff to provide your feedback please!

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

My article last week addressed food waste in our country. Was it surprising to learn that people are responsible for 21% out of 40% of food wasted in the US (USDA statistic)? My hopes are that the article stirred up some concern and motivation to take some action.

Some ways to fight food waste would be: **PLAN YOUR MEALS.** The more precise we are about what we are going to eat and when, the less food we will waste. This effort can also help us to become more creative with left-overs. **STORE YOUR FOOD WELL.** Sustainable America (ivaluefood.com/resources/food-storage/) offers numerous helpful resources for smart food storage, like placing the more recently bought foods towards the back of the fridge. **PRACTICE EMERGENCY USE-IT-UP** measures. There is advice available for using up foods that are moving past peak-freshness (you can find information for recipes at the email address previously noted.) Going out to eat is a big source of food waste. So order carefully, split your portion with someone, and when you can, take leftovers home. At home, **PUT ON YOUR PLATE** only what you intend to eat, taking small portions instead of large ones, which you may not finish.

If you are open to out-of-the-home activities, **SUPPORT FOOD-RESCUE EFFORTS FOR FAMILIES IN NEED**, finding groups, which rescue wasted food from stores and restaurants to supply food pantries (sustainableamerica.org/food-rescue/).

Overall, when it comes to food waste, it takes a mix of dedication and understanding. Realize that it's not going to be 100% all the time. Even just addressing the issue in a limited degree helps.
