

### **2018 ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL:**

Currently, we have had **288** donors and are at **\$58,771.01** in cash donations and **\$23,549.00** in pledges received, totaling **\$82,320.01** which is **142.77%** of our goal of **\$57,660.00**. If you made a pledge to the 2018 Appeal, the Diocese has begun sending reminders so you can fulfill your pledge. Please note that if you chose an auto-debit off your checking account or credit card, you will not receive a reminder.

It is important for all our parishioners to complete their pledges. The assistance that is provided to the ministries and programs the Appeal supports, such as grants to our mission parishes, heating and grocery assistance to families, health insurance for our retired priests and tuition for our future priests to attend the seminary, is based on what is collected.

In addition, all parishes receive back a portion of their amounts collected. This means the more we collect, the more we can address our important parish needs.

**FROM THE ADVOCATES CORNER:****STUTTERING**

Stuttering is a communication disorder in which the flow of speech is broken by repetitions, prolongations, or abnormal stoppages of sounds or syllables. There are different causes of stuttering, one of them can be genetics and another is when a person has a developmental delay of some kind. Stuttering affects about 3 million Americans and over 70 million people worldwide. It affects four times as many males as females. Sometimes children stutter when they are young, but outgrow it. Some famous people that stutter are James Earl Jones and Carly Simon.

Here are some tips for speaking with someone who stutters:

- Don’t make remarks like: “Slow down, take a breath, or relax.” Such simplistic advice can be felt as demeaning and is not helpful.
- Let the person know by your manner that you are listening to what he or she says, not how they say it.
- Maintain natural eye contact and wait patiently and naturally until the person is finished.
- You may be tempted to finish sentences or fill in words. Try not to do so.
- Be aware that those who stutter usually have more trouble controlling their speech on the telephone. Please be patient in this situation. If you pick up the phone and hear nothing, be sure it is not a person who stutters trying to start the conversation before you hang up.
- Speak in an unhurried way, but not so slowly as to sound unnatural. This promotes good communication with everyone.

**Following up on the Church of the Holy Family Earth Day 2018 Challenge. Some credible reasons WHY it is such an important focus:**

**From the Virginian Pilot Article (4/29/18 page 6):**

“Packaging consumes about 40% of plastic world-wide and accounts for about 60% of the materials that end up as waste.” “By 2050, there will be more plastic than fish in the oceans, according to the Ellen MacArthur Foundation. “Currently less, than a third is recycled.”

**From “Great Pacific Garbage Patch:”**

**The Pacific Plastic Island** is currently **twice the size of Texas and four times the size of France.**

**Some Personal Disclosure:**

My husband Durk and I made our commitment to embrace the Plastic Challenge. Step one was to do an assessment of how we are currently doing. **Yikes!** Under the kitchen sink, we saw a plethora of plastic packaged products! The refrigerator and freezer – not much better. In the refrigerator, we actually had eggs packaged in **STYROFOAM!** In the freezer, neatly wrapped in press and seal and then packaged in freezer bags were individual servings of all the stuff you store in your freezer! We knew this was something that was NOT going to be EASY. But we definitely had to BEGIN to change how we make decisions at the source (the initial buying choice) and daily use of materials.

**A Few AH-HA’s:**

So, remember last St. Francis day, when we (the Environmental Committee) collected and offered our used plastic newspaper bags to parishioners with pets and encouraged them to Scoop the Poop and bag it? What a **TERRIBLE** idea that was! That waste was going to be in our landfills “**safely**” protected from **EVER** decomposing.

There are many pet owners who have already figured that was not a great idea. They buy and use **Biodegradable Pet Waste BAGS**. I googled and sure enough there are lots of options! When asked, our pet-owning son immediately TM’ed link to a “Earth-rated” website that they’ve purchased from for years. I could almost hear the silent “duh, mom!”

I **love** my single-serve coffee maker! Every morning it’s there! Ready for me to pop one of those convenient little **PLASTIC pods** in and ta-dah! Google showed me many options to convert to **Biodegradable pods**. There are **Biodegradable Fair Trade Coffee pods!** There are **Biodegradable filters** that fit into that permanent pod that came with the coffee maker!

Change is never easy. Good luck to all of us on this journey toward making God’s great gift of Mother Earth to us!
