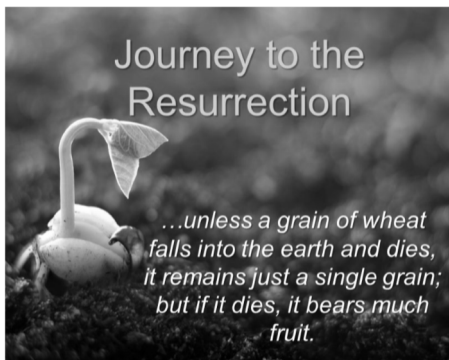

March 18: Fifth Sunday of Lent

Jer 31:31-34 / Heb 5:7-9 / Jn 12:20-23

We are nearing the end of the Lenten season and at the edge of the Passion of Jesus. His hour is upon us. Jesus is about to take up his cross. As his disciples, we are called to follow him. We too are to take up our cross and offer our lives with him. We too are called to bear fruit like the grain of wheat that falls to the ground and dies in order to yield a rich harvest. Yet so often we resist the crosses in our lives, whether out of selfishness or fear. Yet if we wish to follow Christ, we must not turn away from the crosses in our lives. We must love the way he loved us. This week, let us take time to look at a crucifix, to recognize what Jesus has done for us, for each of us, so that we may be where he is, and come to see him face to face.
