Wis 1:13-15, 2:23-24/2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13-15/Mk 5:21-43

"Do not be afraid... just have faith." In today's culture that sounds so naïve, and it often requires a desperate situation for us to finally surrender to depending on faith. Jairus' daughter was at the point of death. As a synagogue official he was likely a wealthy man and probably tried many doctors and the best remedies that money and influence could buy. Similarly, the woman with the hemorrhage had suffered for twelve years and spent everything she had. Yet it is faith that brings life. Jesus heals the woman and restored her to the community. With a hemorrhage she would have been ritually unclean and separated. Jesus calls her "Daughter". Similarly, Jesus restored the little girl to life and family and community. Is there something that needs healing in your life, something that separates you from the love of Christ or the community of faith? Do not be afraid... have faith... and reach out and touch the tassel on his cloak and ask him for healing.

PLANNED GIVING: Capital Campaign

After prayerful reflection on the Diocesan Pastoral Vision and in preparation for the 150th Anniversary of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Ogdensburg (2022), Bishop Terry R. LaValley has announced that a Diocesan-wide Capital Campaign "*It's Our Church, It's Our Future*" kicks off this spring.

The "*It's Our Church, It's Our Future*" Capital Campaign will have a goal of \$16 million, which will include \$1.3 million for the 2018 Bishop's Fund Appeal. Of the funds raised, 75% will remain at the Parish for its local needs such as programs and capital improvements. The remaining 25% benefits the entire Diocese supporting Retired Priests, Seminarians, Camp Guggenheim and St. Mary's Cathedral.

Guidance In Giving, Inc. (GIG) is working with the Diocese on this endeavor and have begun the groundwork with some parishes participating in the initial Block 1 Phase. "*It's Our Church, It's Our Future*" will run in three blocks beginning with Block 1 running April to June. Parishes in Block 2 participate from June to September and campaigns in Parishes in Block 3 take place from September to November.

Catechism Corner:

“What about the Hierarchy of the Catholic Church?”

Pontiff/Magisterium: Pope Francis

The leader of the worldwide Latic Catholic Church, directly descended from St. Peter. “Upon this rock I will build my Church”.

Cardinal: Timothy Cardinal Dolan.

The Pope's closest advisors. These men elect our Pope.

Archbishop: Cardinal Dolan

Yes he is both a Cardinal and our Archbishop. He is a Bishop who governs an Archdiocese. Ours is the Archdiocese of New York.

Bishop: Bishop Terry LaValley

The chief Priest of the Diocese. Our Diocese encompasses St. Lawrence, Franklin, Clinton, Essex and Jefferson counties.

Monsignor: An honorary title granted by the Pope to some Priests for exceptional service to the church. Generally a Priest is over age 65 when this title is granted.

Pastor: A Priest in charge of a Catholic Parish(s)

Diocesan (Secular) Priest: A Priest who works in a specific Diocese under the direction of the local Bishop.

Religious Priest: Yes, all priests are religious, but this refers to Priests who belong to a Religious Community (Dominicans, Carmelites, Jesuits, etc.) and take vows.

Brothers: Men who belong to a Religious order/community and take vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, but are not Priests.

Deacons: There are permanent Deacons, Ordained men who serve their Diocese in ministry, but cannot consecrate the Eucharist, hear Confessions or say Mass. Transitional Deacons are men who are in the process of becoming Priests.
