### Aug. 12th: 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

1Kgs 19:4-8 / Eph 4:30-5:2 / Jn 6:41-51

Our Gospel today is so incredibly rich: bread of life, Eucharist, the true bread of heaven. The audience in today's gospel murmur because they think they know Jesus: after all they know he is the son of Joseph, the carpenter... Do we know Jesus? Have we been drawn by the Father to believe in him? When we approach Him in the Blessed Sacrament, do we know whom it is we are receiving? Do we know the gift of forgiveness and mercy that we are offered through this relationship? Can we imitate Jesus, and *live in Love, as he has first loved us*, and *forgive one another as God has forgiven us in Christ*?

"St. John Vianney is the model and patron for diocesan priests. We need priests, for without priests there is no Eucharist, and without the Eucharist, there is no Church. St. John Paul II, in his final encyclical, stated this as clearly and boldly as possible: Ecclesia de Eucharistia (the Church comes from the Eucharist).

Priests are the descendants of those first disciples who sat in intimacy with Jesus himself, watching him at close quarters, learning his mind and heart, summoned to work for the coming of the kingdom. Priests participate in Christ, precisely in his capacity as head and shepherd of his people.

Priests are called "father," for that is what they are. They give life in the spiritual order. Look to the example of St. John Vianney, who spent hours in the confessional and in the pulpit; to St. Maximilian Kolbe, who offered his life with the words, "I am a Catholic priest"; to Fr. Gary Graf, a Chicago priest who gave part of his own liver so that one of his parishioners might live. They do all of these things because they are spiritual fathers, life-givers in the spiritual order."

### **Catechism Corner:**

#### Major events in the life of Jesus and his Mother

† **Annunciation:** The day God sent His messenger Gabriel the Archangel to ask Mary to be His mother. Through the power of the Holy Spirit Jesus became "incarnate" (takes on human form).

† **Christmas:** The day Christ was born.

† **Presentation:** The day Jesus was brought to the Temple.

† **Holy Thursday:** We celebrate the "first Mass". When Jesus instituted Consecration and Holy Eucharist so the he would become part of us. He became man that we may share in His Divinity.

† **Good Friday:** We take part in the suffering and death of Our Lord and Savior.

† **Easter:** We celebrate the Resurrection of Christ. Not dead, but risen to return to His Father.

† **Ascension:** The day Jesus left His Apostles and returned body, soul and divinity to Heaven.

† **Pentecost:** 50 days after the Resurrection and just 9 days after his Ascension into Heaven, the Lord sent His Holy Spirit upon the disciples gathered in the upper room. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, the Catholic Church was born (made human), just as through His power, Jesus was made human.

† **Assumption:** The day Mary died, but then was immediately taken up to Heaven, body and soul.

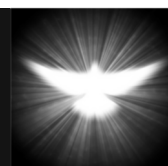
