Nm 11:25-29 / Jas 5:1-6 / Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

I love the combination of the first reading and the Gospel. There is a closed mentality among both the seventy elders who received a portion of Moses' spirit and also among the community of the apostles. In the Gospel, there are people who are doing good in Jesus' name who are not part of the community and the apostles try to stop them: they try to stop them from doing good! Sometimes we can do the same, either with other Christians who are not Catholic, or even with groups in our own parish who maybe are not part of our little clique. Perhaps we judge them to be too progressive, too traditional, or somehow not part of the “good Catholics” whatever THAT means. (Couldn't we all be better?) Yet, if they have received the Holy Spirit and are doing good, can we celebrate that, rejoice in that, and join together to form a stronger community which will draw others to Christ?

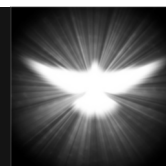
