Is 53:10-11 / Heb 4:14-16 / Mk 10:35-45

Today's readings contrast the earthly view of power versus the strength that is needed to be compassionate and merciful. It is not power that wins over hearts and minds. It is not power that draws people to follow Jesus. If we want to evangelize, we must draw near to Christ in the way that he showed us on the cross. To draw others, we must be willing to be vulnerable and suffer with them, to offer ourselves for them, and to let go of our selfishness and desire for vainglory. This is not something we can do on our own but requires the grace of God. It requires our prayer, participation in the Sacraments, especially the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is the path to holiness for ourselves and all those we meet.

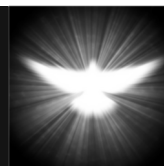
