Bartimaeus, although blind, could see by the light of faith that Jesus was the Son of David. He totally places all his trust in the Lord, even to the point of dropping his cloak, possibly his only real possession and his protection from the elements. Once he is brought before Jesus, Jesus asks him a rather silly question: What do you want me to do? But by asking, Jesus shows respect for the blind man's freedom. Bartimaeus has to ask and by asking to show his act of faith. What a beautiful example of faith and prayer. Do we want a relationship of trust and freedom with Jesus? Then let us ask him to be able to see with the eyes of faith, trusting in his mercy until we see him face to face.

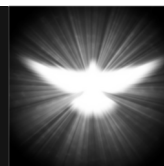
