If you happen to have some children's books you would like to donate, please drop them in the baskets that will be placed at the back of both St. Mary's and St. Joseph's churches. The books will be collected weekly and inspected by our class for distribution to families within our own communities.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

The U.S. bishops are joining together in a commitment of prayer and reparation leading up to the bishop's General Assembly, in Baltimore, November 11-15, where we will be making critical decisions in response to the clergy sexual abuse crisis. With my brother bishops across the nation, I will be dedicating myself to seven days of intensified prayer and fasting, from Monday, November 5, through Sunday, November 11. The intentions for this period of prayer and sacrifice are three-fold:

- *For the healing and support of all victims of clergy sexual abuse;*
- *For the conversion and just punishment of perpetrators and concealers of sexual abuse; and*
- *For the strength of the bishops to be holy shepherds in protecting and leading our faithful from all harm.*

You are welcome to join me in praying for these intentions. I would also be grateful for any prayers for my brother bishops and me during our General Assembly, that we may follow the guidance of the Holy Spirit in responding to the tragedy of clergy sexual abuse in the Church.

Please know of my continued prayers for you and your loved ones.

Catechism Corner: What about Purgatory?

Purgatory exists. Saint Paul writes that we are to be brought "holy, without blemish and irreproachable before God" (Col. 1:22)

The existence of Purgatory logically follows from two facts: our imperfection on earth and our perfection in Heaven. Therefore, the souls in Purgatory, though destined for Heaven, must first undergo their "final purification" (Catechism 1031) which cleanses them from past wrongdoing for which they are not fully atoned.

The souls in Purgatory cannot gain merit for themselves. That is why we pray for those who have died. Remember in your prayers those who have no one to pray for them (living and dead).

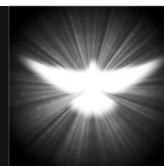
