### Sunday, Nov. 11: 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kgs 17:10-16 / Heb 9:24-28 / Mk 12: 38-44

With today's Gospel about the contrast between self-righteous scribes and the poor woman who put in two coins there is a lot on which we can reflect. The scribes put burdens on the poor and did little to help them. The poor woman gave out of her need and showed her love by sacrificing the little she has. In today's Gospel, Jesus is speaking to the disciples, those whom he know will be "religious leaders" in the future. How easy it is to fall into the trap of thinking we are somehow better, that we know more, that we are "all set". Yet, we are called, like the poor woman, to give of ourselves and to rely on God. This is what it means to truly love another. To be true disciples, we must surrender our lives to God in following the Son, to trust that he will provide. All we have is a gift from God, and we are called to share what we have been given. How easy it is to place our trust in our stuff, our wealth, and to focus on accumulating more and more and forget that it is Jesus who is our strength and who will provide all that we need. Today let us see the needs of those around us and share with them not just a few coins but ourselves.

- AMBO:** The place where the scriptures (Readings and Gospel) are proclaimed.
- CLERGY:** A collective term referring to all those ordained: bishops, priest, and deacons.
- GRACE:** A free gift of God to human beings, grace is a created sharing in the life of God. It is given through the merits of Christ and is communicated by the Holy Spirit. It is necessary for salvation.
- INDULGENCE:** The remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven.
- ABSOLUTION:** Act by which a priest, acting as the agent of Christ, grants forgiveness of sins in the Sacrament of Penance.

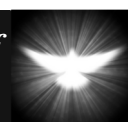
