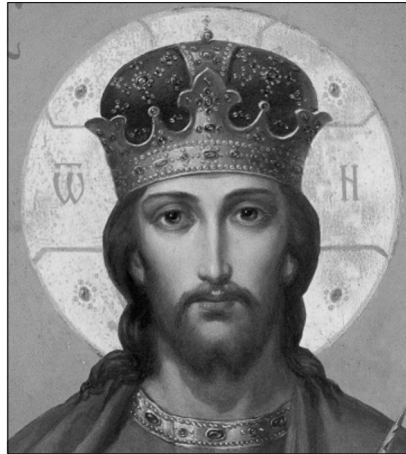

### Sunday, Nov. 18: 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dn 12:1-3 / Heb 10:11-14, 18 / Mk 13:24-32

Jesus is preparing his disciples for the tribulations that lie ahead of them, that they might not lose heart. But he is also speaking to us, calling us to be courageous and to persevere in the faith. We must remain alert and to keep our eyes on Christ. It is so easy to be distracted by all the things on our to-do lists and all the noise that surrounds us.
