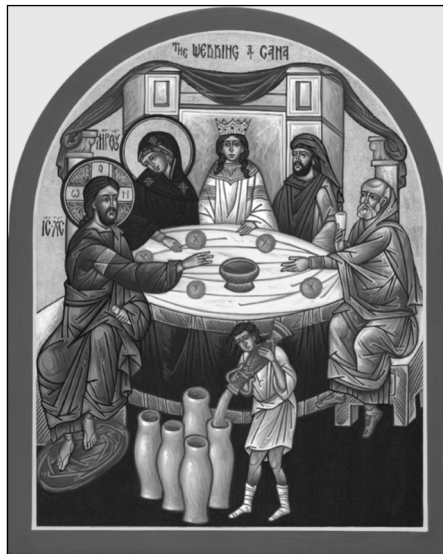

From Father Tom: I realize your concern for the weekend schedule.

During my illness, your cooperation with Deacon Brian has been exemplary and forward-looking. I would like to thank Deacon Brian who, in my absence, has been administering the parishes well.

Sunday, Jan. 20, 2019 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Is 62:1-5 / Cor 12:44-11 / Jn 2:1-11

Both the first reading and the Gospel use wedding imagery: God rejoices in Israel just as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride. Jesus inaugurates his ministry at the wedding of Cana. This gospel is rich in details: Mary alerting Jesus to the lack of wine, and then telling the servants to do whatever he tells them. The empty water jars to be filled with water which Jesus will turn into wine. The superabundance (more than 120 gallons!) of the most excellent wine and the fact that this first sign or miracle lets the disciples begin to believe in Jesus. How have we experienced the abundance of God? How do we share this good news with others?

Day of Prayer for Legal Protection of Unborn Children

January 22nd Day of Prayer and Fasting

The over 56 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children": "In all the Dioceses of the United States, January 22 shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer and fasting. Another way to take part is participating in special events to observe the anniversary of Roe v. Wade. If you are unable to participate physically, please pray for those who are traveling to Washington DC to March for Life.

Special prayers for the 4 people from St. Mary's who will be attending the March for Life for a safe and fruitful journey and please pray to the end of abortion.

Respect Life Collection

The weekend of January 26/27 is the annual Respect Life Collection. Last year twenty-one grants were awarded which benefited those working to build a Culture of Life in our diocese. It's important with this year's legislative climate that we provide alternatives to abortion and help to educate the next generation. The collection provided funds for 7 Gabriel Projects, Plattsburgh Crisis Pregnancy Center, Birthright, Right to Life affiliates, 4 pilgrimages to the DC March for Life (two high school, one college and one family bus), 3 Pro-Life County Fair Booths as well as other pro-life efforts.

PAENITENTIARIA APOSTOLICA

Prot. N. 1283/18/1

DECREE

The APOSTOLIC PENITENTIARY, in order to increase the sanctity of the faithful and the salvation of souls, by the power of the faculties granted to it by the Supreme Pontiff Francis, the Pope by Divine Providence, attentive to the supplications recently brought forth by His Eminence and Most Reverend Daniel N. DiNardo, Cardinal of the Holy Roman Church, Metropolitan Archbishop of Galveston-Houston and President of the Episcopal Conference of the United States of America, kindly grants from the heavenly treasures of the Church a plenary Indulgence, under the normal conditions (sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayers for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff) to be gained by the Christian faithful who are truly repentant and compelled by charity, which indeed they are able to apply to the souls of the faithful having been detained in Purgatory by means of suffrage, if they take part in the sacred celebrations, with the great assembly of people, throughout the whole annual event called "March for Life," which will be celebrated on the seventeenth and eighteenth days of January 2019 in the entire Archdiocese of Washington.

The elderly, the sick, and all who are unable leave home for a grave cause likewise will be able to acquire a plenary Indulgence, if they consciously reject all sin and have the intention to fulfill, as soon as possible, the three customary conditions, if they spiritually join themselves to the sacred functions, with their prayers and sorrows or the discomforts of their own lives having been offered to the merciful God.

In order that access to the attainment of this divine favor through the keys of the Church may more easily be obtained for pastoral charity, this Penitentiary diligently requests that Pastors and priests, duly authorized to hear confessions, offer themselves promptly and with a generous spirit for the celebration of Penance.

The present decree is valid only for this occasion, notwithstanding anything to the contrary.
