From Father Tom: I realize your concern for the week-end schedule.

Thank you for the prayers, novenas, and mass intentions. They are helping me heal. We have had extensive, in-depth planning sessions with the decision that when one priest is available we will have three masses on the week-end. Bishop LaValley has repeatedly stated that he has no back-up priests to help in parishes. We have one priest (in his 80th year) who is officially retired but has agreed to celebrate sacraments for our parishes. In addition, Deacon Brian can baptize, officiate at marriages, and celebrate funerals.

My recovery is slow as doctors have explained to me because of the complex medical issues involved. In the next several months I will need three surgeries, Please continue to pray for me. Consequently, the current "Winter" Schedule will surely continue beyond the winter.

Thank you for your cooperation, understanding, and your good prayers. Please to pray for vocations, particularly from your own family.

During my illness, your cooperation with Deacon Brian has been exemplary and forward-looking. I would like to thank Deacon Brian, who, in my absence, had been administering the parishes well.

Sunday, Feb. 3, 2019 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jer 1:4-5, 17-19 / 1 Cor 12:31-13:13 / Lk 4:21-30

The audience in today's Gospel, the people of Nazareth, thought they knew who Jesus was. He was the carpenter's son. They had watched him grow up. He had often read from the scrolls in the synagogue. And now, he claimed to be the Messiah, God's anointed one, the fulfillment of the scripture passage from Isaiah which we read last week. The people could not see beyond the familiar ordinary man they had known all their lives. As Jesus tells them: *No prophet is accepted in his native place.* Do we accept him? Or do we take Jesus for granted? There is a danger that Mass becomes "routine", that we go through the motions, mouth the words of the prayers, attend mass on autopilot. Do we realize that Jesus, the Messiah, our Lord and Savior comes among us, is truly present in our scripture, in the Eucharist, in the person of the priest, and reflected on the faces of those in our community of faith?
