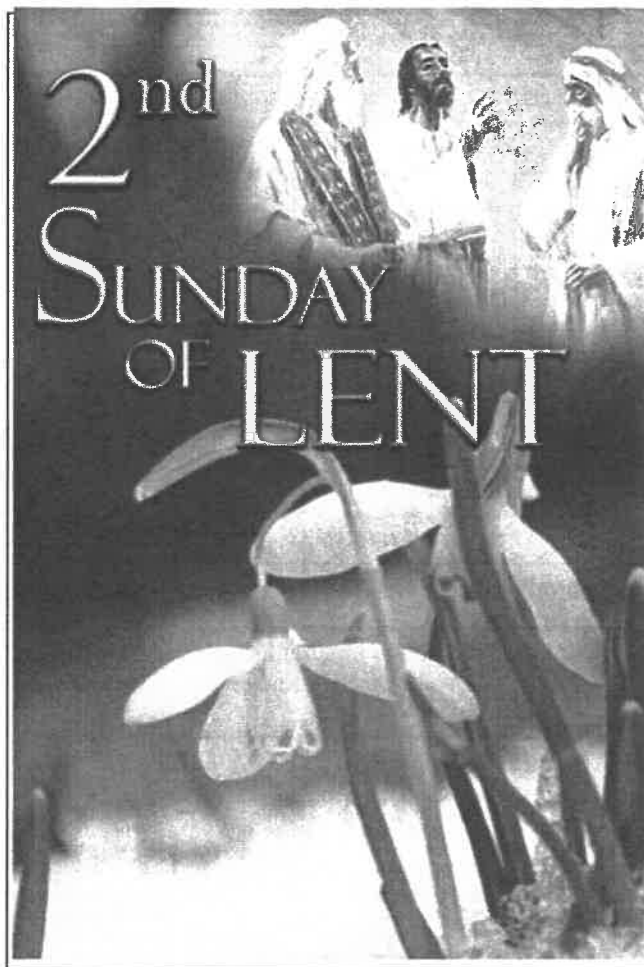

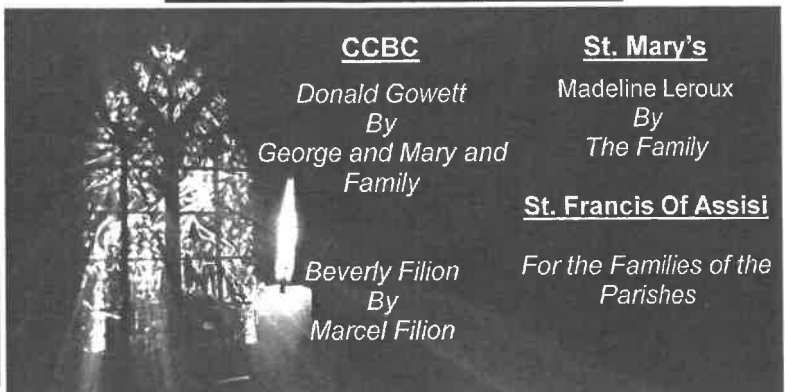

Catholic Heart Workcamp Can Help!

Catholic Heart Workcamp, a weeklong service camp for teenagers, will be coming to Saranac Lake this summer, with 250 participants, and is seeking homes in the Saranac Lake area (within 45 miles of Saranac Lake) at which a small group of teenagers and adults can work. Groups will be available to work on June 24-27, from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Typical projects include: painting homes (both interior and exterior) and garages; cleaning homes (inside and outside); washing windows; doing yardwork such as planting, weeding, raking and clearing brush; staining/painting porches, decks and wheelchair ramps, and cleaning out garages and basements. In addition, teams may be able to complete small construction jobs such as building or repairing railings, porches, steps and wheelchair ramps (depending on the skill level of the adult chaperone). Our focus is on the elderly, disabled, and those unable to hire this work to be done. Those interested in having a CHWC team work at their home can pick up an application at the parish office. 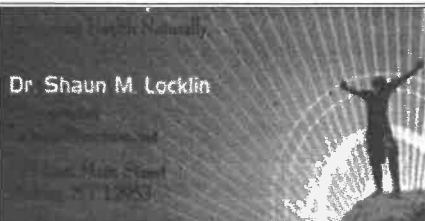

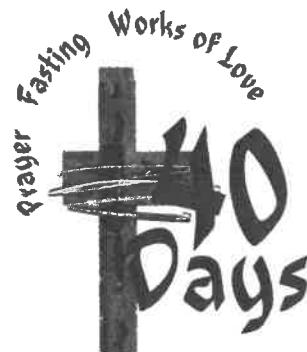
