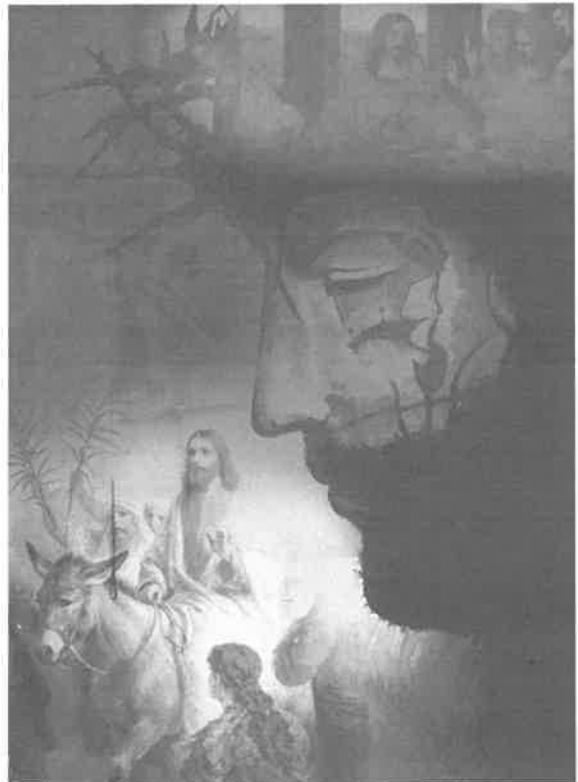

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

The opening Gospel today which starts the liturgy is from the Gospel of Luke (Lk 19:28-40). This is Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. One of the interesting things in Luke's account, unlike the accounts of Mark or Matthew which we hear in other years, is that there are no waving palm branches which one would expect to hear about on Palm Sunday. People spread cloaks in front of Jesus, they proclaim him *blessed as the King who comes in the name of the Lord*, but no triumphant waving of palms are mentioned. The people also do not shout Hosanna! Rather they proclaim Peace: *Peace in heaven and glory in the highest*. We are reminded of the manger scene and the song of the angels. But at the same time, we also remember Herod wanting to kill Jesus as part of that story. Jesus brings peace, but not without division. Our King will not be like other kings. Although he is all powerful, he does not grasp for power, but rather *he humbles himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on the cross*. As we enter this holiest of weeks, let us walk with Jesus. Let us reflect on the part we play in the passion of our Lord. Let us humble ourselves, that we too, may rise with him on Easter morning.

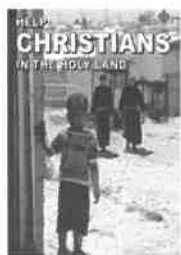

What is the Paschal Fast?

The Paschal Fast begins after the Holy Thursday evening Mass and continues throughout the Triduum until Holy Saturday night. These three days are the most solemn days of our Church year when we remember the Passion and Death of the Lord. During these days, Catholics are asked to eat only what is required and to observe a more contemplative and restrained lifestyle. Treats and desserts are held off until Easter. It is also appropriate to live out the character of the Triduum in greater silence and recollection, limiting television and social media.

"The Master Has Need of You" -Bishop Robert Barron

In our Gospel reading for the Palm Sunday procession, Jesus sends his disciples into Jerusalem to prepare for his triumphal entry. They are told to untether a donkey, and if there is any protest from the owner, they are to say simply, "The Master has need of it." Strictly speaking, God has need of nothing, since he is the unconditioned act of existence. God doesn't need our praise or our good works or anything. But this phrase signals the wonderful truth that God allows us to cooperate with his grace so that we can participate in the work that he wants to do. He gives us what Aquinas called "the dignity of causality." We are privileged to be instruments in his hands.
