Pope Francis says...



More from *Laudato Si'*:

"Climate change is a global problem with grave implications: environmental, social, economic, political, and for the distribution of goods...Its worst impact will probably be felt by developing countries in coming decades. Many of the poor live in areas particularly affected by phenomena related to warming, and their means of subsistence are largely dependent on natural reserves and ecosystemic services such as agriculture, fishing, and forestry. They have no other financial activities or resources which can enable them to adapt to climate change or to face natural disasters, and their access to social services and protection is very limited. For example, changes to climate, to which animals and plants cannot adapt, lead them to migrate; this in turn affects the livelihood of the poor, who are then forced to leave their homes, with great uncertainty for their future and that of their children. There has been a tragic rise in the number of migrants seeking to flee from the growing poverty caused by environmental degradation. They are not recognized by international conventions as refugees...without enjoying any legal protection whatsoever. Sadly, there is a widespread indifference to such suffering."

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION
