## Pastor's Corner

Today's healing by Jesus of the deaf mute is done in private. Jesus is not a "healing machine" but does so with love and compassion and is open to all. Whilst healing He asks the healed person to accept the gift as a personal act of mercy. Yes, Jesus came to heal all mankind but He approaches each one of us uniquely, where we are also. He has no favorites.

We might want to think of this as we look at our reading from James and as we welcome people into our community. We don't only welcome the well shod or the exciting but all people. We mustn't let superficial observations motivate our behavior towards a neighbor. Jesus didn't.

People draw their own conclusions about Jesus of course and often link him up with their own designs. They try to make Him fit. However, despite His obvious power and authority Jesus should be seen as the suffering servant who gives of everything He is for our healing, our salvation. Enjoy the Labor Day break. ## Stewardship Reflection

Today's Gospel from Mark includes an extraordinary occasion when Jesus cured and healed a man who had been unable to hear or speak.

Our Holy Father emeritus Benedict once pointed out that many are inwardly deaf to the world around them and remain mute at a time when the world is in need of spiritual guidance. The former Pope's meditation on that Gospel and that one important word also included a reminder that the Lord speaks to each of us in a language of love, and calls us to be baptized disciples.

The man in the Gospel had been isolated and insulated from the world around him. We may tend to be that way at times also. Jesus calls us to see our vocation in human society, and to strive to be good stewards of that vocation.
