Stewardship Reflection

Why Scripture each week at Mass – Old Testament, New, etc.? The Word of God comes to us through Holy Scripture, the Bible. Simply put, the Bible — Old and New Testaments — is a collection of books written over hundreds of years by those inspired by God to write. In many ways it is the primary witness of our faith. Scripture was written by prophets and apostles in human language. However, it was collected, edited, and sanctioned and blessed by the Church. It is a faith document. This direct word of God, with a Catholic commentary, should be a constant companion as we embark on and continue a life of stewardship which is all about the "greater Glory of God".


St Bernard and St Bridget's Widows Support Group:
