Pastor's Corner

Pope Pius XI instituted the Feast of Christ the King in 1925. Obviously for us Catholics — as this marks the end of the Church Year - the symbolism is that Christ is the beginning and the end of all things. The feast was instituted to counteract several negative phenomena that were arising: the totalitarianism of Communism, Nazi-ism, Nationalism, Socialist Dictatorships etc. The attitude abroad was that the supreme value of all things was the sate. It also counteracted the pietism of the time which was overly sentimental and also the idea that prayer alone would save the world.

Honoring Jesus as Christ and King should help us realize that He is more than just a nice friend or favorite brother; He is the ruler of the universe and the judge of all. He is also the head of the communion of the living and the dead and should be at the very center of our lives. Jesus is merciful but He is just; human but divine, meek but mighty. May we prepare well during Advent as we celebrate His coming us Man. God bless you all.

Stewardship Reflection

People tend to say "I go to church." In reality, Christ does not call us to "go" to church; He calls us to be Church. We should live our lives in such a way that it is clear we are Catholic and Christian and part of Christ's Kingdom, for He is our King. Were you aware that the name "Christ" is a royal title in itself? In Greek it means "the anointed king."

Pius XI wrote at that time: For Jesus Christ reigns over the minds of individuals by His teachings, in their hearts by His love, in each one's life by living according to His law and by imitating His example.
