DEAR PARISHIONER:

I hope you had a great Thanksgiving holiday. As you may know, I spent mine with my mother in western NY. For most of the time it was just the two of us - so, it was a very, very quiet few days. My mother, as many 95 year old people do, spends a significant part of every day dozing. The picture in my mind of our times spent together is the two of us sitting in companion lazy-boys in her home, her sleeping and me reading.

Although, in all honesty, I found myself rubber necking it every once in awhile, and waking myself up as my nose hit the book. It kind of worried me - am I getting "that" old? Well, of course not, I was simply bored, yeh - that's the ticket. Who wouldn't have to fight a bit of sleep just sitting around all day? Self-deception continues to be a wonderful comfort. Isn't it great?

The real fun happened on Thanksgiving Day, when my youngest brother and his family joined us for the Thanksgiving meal. It became a bit more boisterous, lively and messy - especially with the kids two years old and under. It was a great visit! Thank God, they finally went home. Mom and I needed a nap.

On a different topic, I received some good news this past Monday. Bishop Boyea with the support of his

Presbyteral Council accepted our request to finalize the merger of St. Joseph and St. Mary parishes with the new name, Holy Family Parish. Congratulations! A long effort by many people is now complete. Special thanks goes out to the Transition Team, which worked with Sr. Rita Wenzlik from the Diocese and, the Pastoral Councils from both parishes. They are mostly responsible for getting this job completed. Great job!

I was informed by Sr. Rita that we will receive the official decree sometime during the second week of December. Once we have received it, it is to be posted at both sites, with the understanding that any parishioner can protest the decree. If any legitimate protests to the decree are sent to the Bishop within two weeks of its posting, the merger will be postponed until the protest can be resolved. Once the decree is posted, you will be notified as to its location.

On a similar topic, the various committees and organizations in the parishes that can begin working as one continue to meet and work to structure how they can become one committee. Most recently, the two Liturgy Committees met to do just that. It was a very productive and amicable meeting. Our deliberations resulted in the following decisions: Each committee will be responsible

for the Advent/Christmas season in their particular parish. Once Christmas season is concluded, they will meet as one committee and begin planning for Lent.

Whatever can be done similarly at both sites, will be done. We also agreed that it is important to provide for and be sensitive to the different customs, liturgical spaces and resources that each has. This means that we won't be cloning the two sites, but will work to collaborate and present a unified experience of worship, as much as possible.

I want to thank the members of these committees for their open mindedness and collaborative spirit. It reflects the best of what we can be together.

With that, happy first Sunday of Advent and have a blessed week.

This **Friday, December 7th** is "Double Match Day" at Meijer in Adrian. Pick up a Simply Give card in the Baptistry or at the Meijer check outs, donate \$10 with the card when you check out, and Meijer will match it with their \$20 and we receive \$30 for our food

pantry! We currently use these cards to purchase milk, eggs, and needed items for the pantry. We thank Meijer for including us in the program.

We have an immediate need for **macaroni and cheese**. Every family receives at least one box when they visit but we were not able to purchase any from the Food Bank. If you can donate some, please leave it in the Baptistry or at the pantry.

Are you among those who have reached their 70 1/2 birthday and are required to take a **Required Minimum Distribution** from some of your investments? If so, did you know that you can have all or part of your RMD directed to a 501(c)3 organization, such as SVDP, and it will be tax-free to you? This is a real advantage to you if you are looking for ways to reduce your income tax liability. It is **IMPORTANT** that you discuss this with your accountant or investment company **BEFORE** the distribution is made. The distribution must go directly from your investment to SVDP to qualify.

As we begin **Advent** we are called to "wait" in joyful anticipation for the grace of Christmas to once again bless our lives. There are poor families within walking distance of our pantry. When in need, they come to us for help. They are, in effect, coming to ask for your help. Your gift to St. Vincent de Paul will help the poor celebrate the grace of God's love this Christmas. La Hna. Rita me informó que recibiremos el decreto oficial alrededor de la segunda semana de diciembre. En un tema similar, los diversos comités y organizaciones en las parroquias que pueden comenzar a trabajar como una continúan reuniéndose y están trabajando para






