A Reflection on the Gospel from the 2015 Living Liturgy:

Whom among us, when seriously ill, does not chase after every means possible—both medicinally and spiritually—to be healed? In this Sunday’s gospel a woman has had an illness for twelve years and Jairus’s twelve-year old daughter is dead. We would expect the woman and Jairus to go to any length to overcome their tragedies. And they do. Both Jarius and the “woman afflicted with hemorrhages” have faith that Jesus would heal. What, really, is their faith? Simply in Jesus’ power to heal. Even to raise from the dead? This they and the crowd would know from heresay or other encounters with Jesus. However, the faith that saves is an act of coming to Jesus. In both cases their faith gave them the courage to approach Jesus and raised their expectation that he had the power to heal. Our faith, too, gives us courage and expectation. What do we do with it? Our first challenge is to come to Jesus with open hearts.

The crowd is “utterly astounded” after Jesus raises Jairus’s daughter back to life. The miracle cued them into the new situation. The challenge of this gospel is that we must see a new situation in all of life’s circumstances, precisely because Jesus is present and so absolutely nothing is the same. The challenge is to see the little “miracles” that happen every day in our lives simply because God has as much care for us as Jesus had care for Jairus’s daughter and the woman. God always can bring something new out of the ordinary, out of pain, out of even death. The Good News of Jesus’ life and mission is that suffering and death are not hopeless situations, but out of them come life. All we need is faith and trust in Jesus. All we need to do is come to him.
