A Reflection of the Gospel from Living Liturgy

2018: We have all heard of the shamrock, which, according to legend, was used by St. Patrick to represent the Holy Trinity to the native Irish in the early fifth century. But, of course, God is more than a sprig, and the relationship between the persons of the Trinity is more complex and subtle than three leaves. The gospel scene is after Easter, but in Galilee. According to Matthew, this is the first and only appearance of the risen Jesus to his disciples (only eleven now in a somber reminder of Judas’s fate). Still, the disciples doubt. They receive the command that has been referred to as “the Great Commandment”: Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, / baptizing them in the name of the Father, / and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.” Matthew’s baptismal formula for making a disciple is the same as what Christians use today. Based on this “Great Commandment,” Christianity has become a worldwide religion. From a mountaintop in Galilee, those initial disciples made other disciples by baptism, who made still more disciples by baptism and so on, until our very day. Discipleship funded on baptism into the life of the Trinity is much more powerful than a shamrock, or even the sun.
