**Scripture Insights**

Reading the signs of the times! The tone and words of today's readings appear dark and troubling, but they are intended to offer us hope and expectation. Our First Reading, from the prophet Daniel, looks forward to an afterlife where those faithful to God will rise to an eternal life. This passage is the earliest reference in the Scriptures to hope in an individual resurrection.

Today's Gospel passage comes from a chapter in Mark's Gospel in which Jesus speaks, for the entire chapter, about his Second Coming at the end of time. Jesus uses images, pictures, and the imagination of the Jewish people to describe this event. He is not giving a blueprint for exactly what is going to take place in the future. Instead, by means of the images, he conveys a simple truth that he will return at the end of time. We proclaim this truth in the Apostles Creed: "I believe in the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come."

Jesus' words are not meant to be terrifying. The apocalyptic imagery at least partly reflects the suffering and evil that people were already experiencing. This evil will surely be vanquished when Christ returns, and this vanquishing of evil will surely entail some chaos before the dawn of peace. As part of the Gospel, the Good News, Jesus' words offer us the hope that we are destined for eternal life. The Gospel calls on us to be watchful and to lead our lives in expectation of the master's return. *When* he will come is not important; what is important is that we lead our daily lives prepared to meet him when in fact he does return, as we pray daily in the Our Father, "Thy Kingdom come!"

We can be sure that the world as we know it will pass away, but one thing remains steadfast: "My words will not pass away!"

## Nadie conoce el día ni la hora

NO MUCHOS HAN escuchado la palabra “escatología.” No, no es ninguna enfermedad nueva, ni una firma transnacional. Así se le llama a esa área de la teología católica que estudia la historia humana en su etapa final, que llamamos plenitud de los tiempos y en la que la injusticia y el sufrimiento llegaran a su fin. Para muchos, pensar que “el final esta cerca” puede causarles zozobra y hasta miedo, como leemos en el evangelio de Marcos. Cuantas veces hemos escuchado a gente aprovecharse de momentos trágicos para infundir miedo y decir que el fin del mundo ya esta cerca! Cuando las Sagrada Escrituras utilizan imágenes apocalípticas como en el evangelio de hoy, no es para infundir temor y predecir catástrofes sino para anunciar con ese lenguaje simbólico que el mal no esta por encima del bien, que las tribulaciones y los sufrimientos no son perdurables. La lectura debe ser siempre iluminada por la presencia de Cristo quien mostrará su poder y victoria sobre el mal, para salvarnos (Jn 3:17).

En años recientes, hemos sido testigos de cómo hay corrientes de pensamiento que promueven vivir al ritmo que marque el cuerpo, el aquí y el ahora sin esfuerzo, a disfrutar regaladamente de la vida sin ocuparse ni preocuparse, y a asentir a todo lo que sea divertido, entretenido y evasivo. A este género de vida le llamamos vida feliz. Estos modos de pensar también niegan toda posibilidad de una vida eterna después de la muerte y afirman que pensar en un más allá es inútil e ingenuo.

La lectura del evangelio siembra esperanza en todos aquellos que se sienten atribulados y desanimados por el triunfo aparente de la muerte y de la injusticia, del mal profundo en el alma de algunos seres humanos que buscan egoístamente el poder y lo material como lo único y absoluto. Nuestra esperanza de vida esta en Cristo Jesús que por su muerte y resurrección nos abre el camino a una nueva vida, una creación nueva que no será manchada por el pecado, donde no habrá más llanto y desesperación.
