
PASTOR'S PARISHABLES

NON EST

DEUS EST

Last Sunday, Trinity Sunday, we pointed out window art in our churches honoring the Blessed Trinity. In St. Mary's, we've mentioned before the unique diagram with lettering all in



As I took note of the Trinity symbols in SS Peter & Paul, I noticed above them, almost hidden but larger, in 2 circular windows, an alpha & an omega, the A & Z of the Greek alphabet. (The alpha in the window is rendered with a flourish, unlike the plain one in the graphic above.) They illustrate words spoken by the glorious Christ at the end of the Book of Revelation (22:13): "I am the alpha & the omega, the first & the last, the beginning & the end." As the footnote in my Bible says, Christ here applies to himself words used by God in Revelation 1:8, "I am the alpha & the omega, says the Lord God, 'the one who is & who was & who is to come, the almighty'." Those words are familiar to us, partly (at least to me) because we hear them at the beginning of the Easter Vigil when the Easter candle is prepared before it's lit from the new fire: "Christ yesterday & today, the Beginning & the End, the Alpha & the Omega...." Windows. Art. Faith. What a study.

How about some calendaring? This week includes 2 "solemnities": Sacred Heart of Jesus on Fri. (the Friday after Corpus Christi) & The Nativity of John the Baptist on Sat., June 24. And this coming Wed., June 21, besides being the so-called 1st day of summer, is the feast day of St. Aloysius Gonzaga. He got honorable mention a couple of months ago because the Jesuit U bearing his name made the finals of the NCAA bb tournament. There's far better reason to know his name than that; you may want

to learn a little about his life. In the Liturgy of the Hours on his feast day is a letter he wrote to his mother as he was dying—he was just 23—including: "Take care above all things, most honored lady, not to insult God's boundless loving kindness; you would certainly do this if you mourned as dead one living face to face with God, one whose prayers can bring you in your troubles more powerful aid than they ever could on earth. And our parting will not be for long; we shall see each other again in heaven; we shall be united with our Savior."

I'm still celebrating our May rush at SS Peter & Paul in the 2017 Catholic Ministries Appeal that put us over our goal. As I glanced over the May progress 2-3 weeks ago across our 21-parish deanery, I noticed that there was modest progress in most parishes but in 3, double-digit increases: 16% in Waldorf, 18% in Janesville, and ... a 38% increase (from 65% to 103% of goal) in Blue Earth! Here are the up-to-the-minute #s locally:

SS PP: 58 (19.9%) have given \$16,946 (<u>103.9%</u>) of goal! St M: 23 (23.4%) have given \$ 3,205 (55.2%) of goal.

An open letter to Fr. Stenzel: I bring special joy to your 50th anniversary. I wasn't at your ordination in 1967 & only knew you from a distance. Wells beat Mapleton in too many football & basketball games for me to like your home town very much. All that has changed (although I still love Blue Earth better)! In 1967, I was just finishing my 1st year in the seminary & still getting acquainted with the world of ministry & the clergy. Little did I know that in 7 years or so, I would meet you—& more. I was now ordained & St. Francis in Rochester was the parish Bishop Watters sent me to for my baptism as a priest. And there you were, the other associate, along with a couple of other priests. First impressions & experiences are important. Those 1st 4 years at St. Francis were more formative than any since & your presence & mentoring were an important part of that. I got some good momentum right at the start. At 26 & green as grass, I began day-to-day life as a priest in a rectory with a good mix of personal, pastoral & priestly life with you. I know that our young priests today don't have the advantage that I did so many years ago (& you did before that): living 10 years or so as an associate with maybe 10-15other priests in several different parishes before taking on the responsibility of pastoring. I have a collection of Priest's Passages from the Bible; this is one of my favorites: "God's flock is in your midst; give it a shepherd's care. Watch over it willingly, generously. Be examples to the flock, not lording it over those assigned to you, so that when the chief Shepherd appears you will win for yourselves the unfading crown of glory" (1 Peter 5:2, 4). You were an example to me—but I'm not going to say any more because you'll say I'm getting sappy. Happy anniversary, & many more. Fr. Klein

April 25, 2017 Finance Council Minutes

The meeting was opened with a prayer service.

Roll Call: Fr. Klein, Dan Welder, Joe Tempel, Bruce Hanson, Skip Schimek, Marsha Engler

- <u>Fr. Klein's report</u>: 1.) Pastoral and Liturgical events were reviewed and upcoming events noted. 2.) Bell ringer is in place and working.
- 3.) The move of the choir area is progressing. The wiring has been started by Anderson Electric.
- 4.) The cost of the Priest's Pension Plan will be decreased for our parish.
- 5.) Project Rice Bowl raised \$2,474.99 from both parishes.
- 6.) A review was given for the Annual Catholic Ministry Appeal with a comparison from last year to this year.
- 7.) Discussion for possible Pentecost decorating.

Minutes: The minutes of the March 22nd meeting were approved as written

Old Business: 1.) Greg Young has agreed to make the needed repairs to the social hall steps.

- 2.) Tuck pointing of the north side of the church has not been done. This will be scheduled at a time when the Krause crew is in the area at another job site.
- 3.) Fr. Klein will check with the diocese and St. Patrick's Guild to see about stabilizing the Stations of the Cross in the church.
- 4.) Duane received bids from Baargen on repairs to the north parking lot. There were three possible options. It was voted to approve the repairs with the option Duane thought was needed.

5.) Improvements to the outside protective glass on the stained glass windows were revisited.

Duane has contacted Fairmont Glass to get bids for the windows on the north side of the church.

There are five smaller windows and the one large window.

New Business: 1.) Duane noted that the three large evergreen trees on the south side of the church do not allow grass to grow and the soil erodes more every year. None of the group wanted to see the trees removed. Fr. will contact Frank Haag to see if there would be a possibility to landscape under the trees for a better appearance that would stop the erosion.

2.) Frank Haag will also be asked to give suggestions for replacing the tree at the north end of the boulevard that had to be removed.

Financial Report: Approved as presented.
