PASTOR'S PARISHABLES

Happy new year to all our students returning to school, to teachers & staff members of schools. We have had special thoughts these days for those starting pre-school & kindergarten, those moving into junior high & high school, those going on to college & university levels.

We also commend new teachers as well as families with school-age children who have moved to town & are being initiated into a new school as well as a new community. These are big steps, but we recognize the smaller ones too—every step of the way & all new beginnings—& encourage all those involved.

Labor Day is Monday. Labor Day doesn't enjoy the significance that holidays like Memorial Day, Independence Day & Thanksgiving Day enjoy. The meaning of those secular holydays is clear in our minds & our observance of them includes more than just a day off. But Labor Day? How do you celebrate work? Or why!? Ask the unemployed, or those with menial & meaningless jobs. They know why some celebrate Labor Day. Some of the rest of us know too.

Teachings like Pope John Paul's have given us insight & inspiration: "Work is a good thing for man, a good thing for his humanity—because through work man not only transforms nature, adapting it to his own needs, but he also achieves fulfillment as a human being & indeed in a sense becomes more a human being."

There's a "Blessing of Tools or Other Equipment for Work" in our Catholic Church's Book of Blessings. Its introduction says, "This blessing enables us to realize that our work forms a bond & a channel of mutual service & charity between the members of the human family; that by our labor we can share in the work of perfecting God's creation." Noble thoughts. May this Labor Day bring you a nobler view of your own labor.

Do you hear that definition of "religion" this Sunday? This is from the always-practical St. James: "<u>Religion that is pure & undefiled before God & the Father is this</u>: to care for orphans & widows in their affliction, & to keep oneself unstained by the world."

- Caring for the needy, &
- Keeping oneself "unstained by the world." So how do we do that? How do be in the world but not of the world?
- 1st, Christ has not called all to withdraw from the world. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son," St. John says. This brings to mind a teaching of our Church from Vatican II, in its document on "The Church in the Modern World." (aka Gaudium et Spes in Latin, its opening words). It doesn't call for rejection of the world; listen: The joy & hope, the grief & anguish of the people

of our time, especially of those who are poor or afflicted in any way, are the joy & hope, the grief & anguish of the followers of Christ as well. Nothing that is genuinely human fails to find an echo in their hearts. For theirs is a community composed of people who, (united in Christ & guided by the Holy Spirit), press onwards towards the kingdom of the Father & are bearers of a message of salvation intended for all. This is why Christians cherish a feeling of deep solidarity with the human race & its history.

But even as we embrace "the joy & hope" of the world, we recognize the hostile environment in which we live. We remember the words of Christ in his Holy Thursday prayer to the Father: "I have given them Your word; and the world has hated them, because they are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. I do not ask You to take them out of the world, but to keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world." (John 17:14-16). Yes, there's a tension between the "deep solidarity" we have with the human race & hostile environment the world is—how easily "stained" by it we are, as St. James warns.

Finally, we cite 2 other New Testament authors, encouraging us to stay engaged in this world, but at the same time unstained. St. John: "Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him (1 John 2:15). And St. Paul: "I wrote you in my letter not to associate with immoral people; I did not at all mean with the immoral people of this world, or with the covetous and swindlers, or with idolaters, for then you would have to go out of the world (1 Corinthians 5:9-10). And from his letter to the Romans (12:2): And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect.

The upcoming Supreme Court vacancy provides us with yet another occasion requiring *focused* prayer. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops does not support or oppose the confirmation of any presidential nominee. However, given this historic moment, the U.S. bishops are urging all people of good will to pray that a change in the U.S. Supreme Court may move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law and welcomed in life.

I'm still getting accustomed to calling us "The Diocese of Winona-Rochester" & knowing that we have a "co-Cathedral." There are 185 dioceses in our country; we are now among the 16 that have a co-cathedral. The nearest is here in our own state: the Basilica of St. Mary in Minneapolis became a co-cathedral in 1966 & the archdiocese took on a new name to include both Twin Cities.
