JANUARY MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING CONTINUED

c. The Finance Chairman, Charles Going, reported that the Committee approved the financials through October and that the total ordinary receipts for October 2017 were \$65,036 compared to \$65,220 for October 2016. Salary and fringe benefits expenses were less this October by \$1,700. Purchased services were less this October by \$5,742; the cost of repairs decreased by \$4,497 and total expenses decreased by \$9,820. Regarding the year to date, total income was \$79,364, less than July through October of 2016. In addition, the Centennial Campaign is \$79,718 less so the Parish is almost even in collections. Diocesan assessment is \$12,186 higher than year to date. Salary and fringe are very close. Purchased services are up \$7,547 and repairs are up \$3,267. Total expenses have increased by \$19,816 because of the Diocese assessment fee and the increase in expenses due to needed repairs in the parish. The Parish is in the black through October 2017 for \$14,550 which includes the Centennial Campaign collection of \$15,196. The total amount of cash in the bank was \$797,080 which was less than October 31, 2016 by \$17,751.

e. Keith Hebert reported on Spirituality and Social Justice stating that Redemptorist Father Kevin McDonald from Boston presented a mission titled "The Eucharist" for the 2017 Advent Mission that was held on the evenings of Sunday, Dec. 3 through Tuesday, Dec. 5.

Regarding outreach that is done in conjunction with the E.C.O.M. (Evangeline Christian Outreach Ministry), the Annual Blanket Drive was held to collect clean, new or used blankets, sleeping bags, other bedding items or small heaters to be given to the barn workers at Evangeline Downs racetrack in Opelousas and Carencro to help minister to the needy backstretch workers, the vast majority whom are Catholics, from throughout the country and who make up a large segment of horse racing's vast workforce.

The Men's Group and Friday morning Bible Study Group collected funds to provide a hot Thanksgiving Day meal to the Evangeline Downs racetrack workers. This was the 10th year for this Thanksgiving Day meal and was held in conjunction with E.C.O.M. Over the past few years, approximately \$1,000 has been collected for the Thanksgiving Day meal that is deeply appreciated by the racetrack workers and ministry team at Evangeline Downs.

The December Men's Mass was held on Thursday, December 14, 2017, in the conference room of LHC on Heather Drive. Fr. Austin Leger celebrated Mass with 35 men in attendance. Chicken salad sandwiches and chicken tenders from Mama's Fried Chicken were enjoyed by all!

Mother Teresa, who founded the Missionaries of Charity in 1950, came to Lafayette in July 1986 to establish a chapter of her order here in Lafayette. Mother Teresa was a longtime friend of Fr. Joseph Brennan, and during her visit she prayed at St. Genevieve Church and spoke to the people of Acadiana in a packed Cajundome on July 10, 1986. The Missionaries of Charity continue to witness the Gospel in Acadiana with four religious sisters serving in Lafayette today.
