#### MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

My Dear Parishioners:

For those who missed reading the bulletin last week, I want to reintroduce Jean Vanier, CC, GCQ. He was born on 10 September 1928 in Canada. He is a layman who studied at the Catholic University of Paris and now lives in France. Among the many things Professor Vanier has done (teaching, lecturing, writing), he is most famous for starting a community of people with developmental disabilities called L'Arche in 1964. He continues to live in a L'Arche community in France. There are 147 L'Arche communities in 37 countries. The name of his community means in English "the ark" and refers to Noah's Ark. He is 90 years old. Truly, he is a very holy and special Catholic theologian. Recently published in thetablet.co.uk, and posted on Facebook, Jean Vanier shared ten points of advice for humanity. Below I quote them (5 last weekend, 5 this weekend). I am using his holy and sage advice in my prayer.

## 6. Ask people "What is your story?"

Vanier emphasizes the importance of relating to people and listening to them. He says, "To meet is to listen: Tell me your story? Tell me where your pain is? Tell me where your heart is? What are the things you desire?" He adds, "I need to listen to you because your story is different to my story."

#### 7. Be aware of your own story

"You are precious. You have your ideas: political, religious, non-religious, you have your vision for the world. Your vision for yourself," says Vanier. He acknowledges that when we fear our identities, worldviews, and cherished opinions are being taken away from us, we are liable to become angry. He adds, "we have to discover where our fears are because that is the fundamental problem." He asks, "Maybe in your story there is a story about fear?

### 8. Stop prejudice: meet people

Vanier says, "The big thing about being human is to meet people." We need to "meet people who are different" and "discover that the other person is beautiful.

## 9. Listen to your deepest desire and listen to it

Vanier says, "We are very different from birds and dogs. Animals are very different." He says that unlike animals there is a "sort of cry of the infinite within us. We're not satisfied with the finite." He asks, "Where is your greatest desire?"

# 10. Remember that you'll die one day

"I'm not the one who's the king of the world and I'm certainly not God," says Vanier. "I'm just somebody who was born ninety years ago and will die in a few years' time and then everybody will have forgotten me. This is reality. We're all here, but we are just local people, passengers in a journey. We get into the train, we get out of the train, the train goes on."

With reliance upon Our Lady Queen of Angels, I remain In the Lord Jesus.

- A dream comes true In October 1948, a long held dream of Bishop Jeanmard came true. Lafayette was to have a minor seminary for young men to begin their studies towards the priesthood. Thirty-three young men were in the first class of students. The official dedication of Immaculata Minor Seminary took place on October 24, 1949, with Bishop Cicognani, the Pope's apostolic delegate to the United States, officiating. The seminary was run by the Society of Mary (Marists) who served as faculty, and the Sisters of the Holy Family who oversaw the domestic arrangements. Immaculata Seminary consisted of four years of high school and the first two years of college. It closed as a seminary in 1977.
