MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

My Dear Parishioners:

When I was in Israel this time, I experienced several new things. Since we went with a Rabbi and some other Jewish people, I saw and experienced many Jewish sites and things which I had never seen before. For instance, in all my years, I had never attended a Friday night Jewish synagogue service before. The closest I ever came to experiencing that, until this trip, happened many years ago in New Iberia. On one end of the 300 block of Charles Street was our house and on the other end was the Jewish synagogue. One Friday evening, I went sit on the back steps of the synagogue to hear the chanting. This trip, I actually participated in prayer. The Rabbi of that synagogue was a woman, deeply spiritual and keenly insightful. Because the Rabbi with whom we were travelling knew her, we were invited to her home to share Sabbath meal with her husband and their children. During the meal, she posed a question, stemming from her sermon which was spoken in Hebrew. She spoke about Noah, the rescuer, and she asked us "Who has been a Noah in your life?" "Who has been the one to protect you from the flood?" And we went around the table and shared. It was a moving experience as we dug deeply into our human experiences to name but one who was Noah for us all. There were tears, there was joy, there was laughter, but above all, there was a sense of gratitude that one could almost touch. I have been blessed to have several Noahs throughout my life. I am grateful. Who has been Noah for you? Ponder that and be grateful.

- **A Diocese of All Saints** – The Churches of the Diocese of Lafayette are under the patronage of a wide array of Saints. The Blessed Mother is the most popular patron of Acadiana Churches with 34 Churches under her patronage through a variety of titles. St. Joseph has 14 Churches under his patronage. Other patrons span the centuries from St. Peter to St. Pius X, and from St. Mary Magdalen to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. Only 8 Church parishes do not evoke a Saint in their patronage. Five of those belong to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, while Holy Ghost, Holy Trinity, and Holy Cross round out the eight.

- **Centennial Mass – All are invited** – the closing Mass for the Centennial Year of our Diocese will be December 12th at the Cajundome Convention Center at 6pm. Our Diocese and the wonderful people of our diocese and how God has poured forth His Love and guidance upon us in these last 100 Years will be the focus – A Century of Love. Along with the Mass, there will be a Historical Display before and after the Mass as well as a presentation of the many people and cultures of our Diocese.
