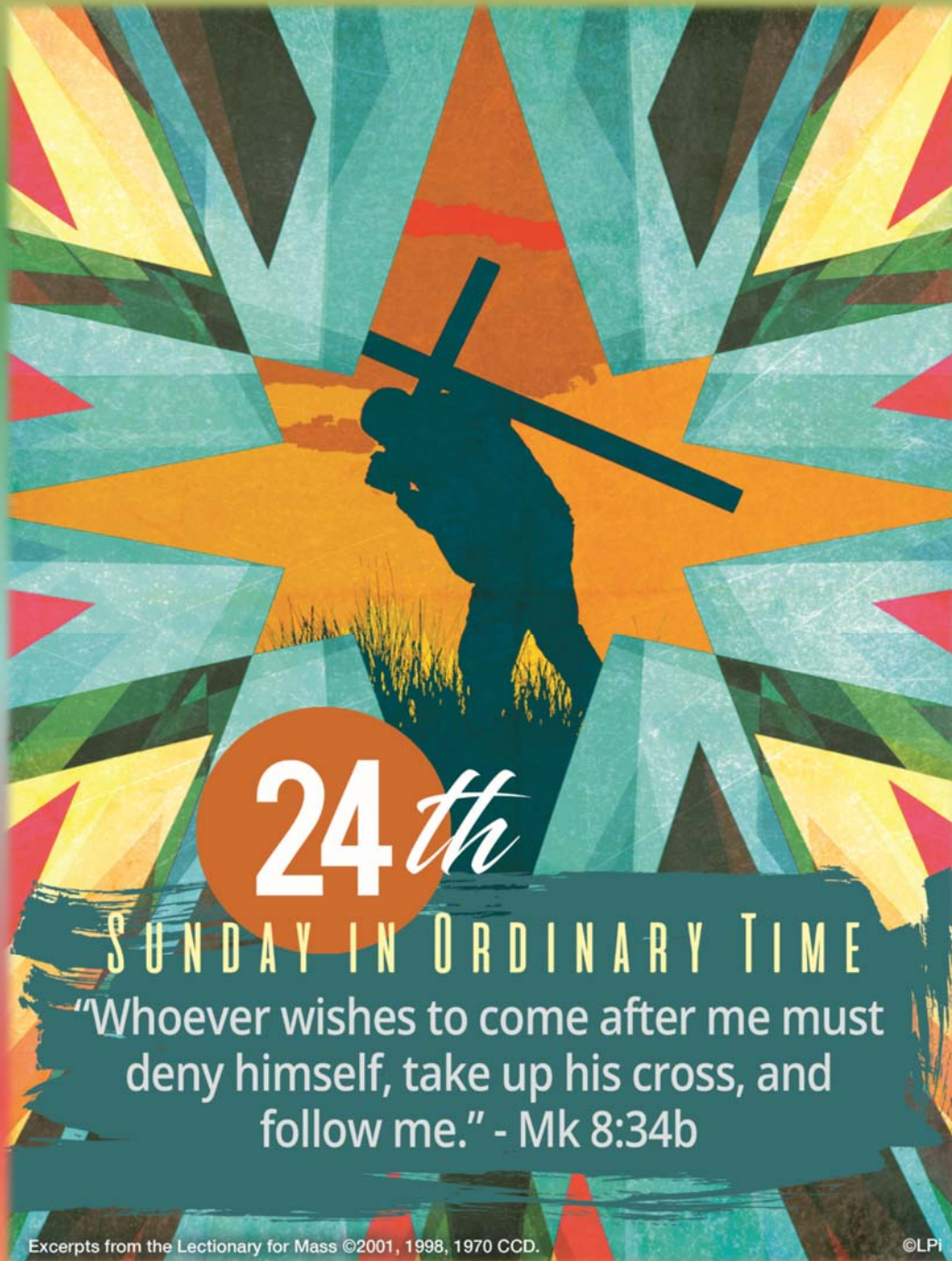

Ways 6-10 to spread the Good News:



6. Say "thank you" as often as you can. Expressing gratitude makes you appreciative of what you have. Gratitude is a beautiful virtue. It makes you, and those you thank, happy!
7. Choose to be a disciple of Jesus Christ; not simply a volunteer: pray, fast, give alms. Do works of service. Gently share your faith and explain how it brings you happiness.
8. Try always to do things in love. Let the love you choose be "agape love"... that is, love for the sake of the other.
9. Keep Sunday holy: try not to spend money or engage in competitive organized sports on the Sabbath. Try not to do things that require others to work on Sundays, emergencies excluded.
10. Forgive others, sincerely.
