



Thought you might enjoy this interesting Prayer given in Kansas at the opening session of their Senate.

It seems prayer still upsets some people.

When Minister Joe Wright was asked to open the new session of the Kansas Senate, everyone was expecting the usual generalities; But this is what they heard:

Heavenly Father, we come before you today to ask your forgiveness and to seek your direction and guidance.

We know Your Word says, 'Woe to those who call evil good,' but that is exactly what we have done. We have lost our spiritual equilibrium and reversed our values. We have exploited the poor and called it the lottery. We have rewarded laziness and called it welfare. We have killed our unborn and called it choice. We have shot abortionists and called it justifiable. We have neglected to discipline our children and called it building self-esteem.

We have abused power and called it politics. We have coveted our neighbor's possessions and called it ambition. We have polluted the air with profanity and pornography and called it Freedom of expression.

We have ridiculed the time-honored values of our forefathers and called it enlightenment. Search us, Oh, God, and know our hearts today; cleanse us from every sin and set us free.

Amen!

The response was immediate. A number of legislators walked out during the prayer in protest. In 6 short weeks, Central Christian Church, where Rev. Wright is pastor, logged more than 5,000 phone calls with only 47 of those calls responding negatively. The church is now receiving international requests for copies of this prayer from India, Africa and Korea. With the Lord's help, may this prayer sweep over our nation and wholeheartedly become our desire so that we again can be called 'one nation under God.'

If possible, please share this prayer with your friends. "If you don't stand for something, you will fall for anything."

Think about this: If you send this Prayer to everyone on your e-mail list, in less than 30 days it would be heard by the entire world.

My deepest thanks to all parishioners of St. Timothy parish for all you do to increase charity and to take on sacrifice.







LOOK FOR THIS TODAY AT MASS -

Following the Gloria and opening prayer, we proceed to a series of Bible readings. These have been arranged by the Church in a meaningful way. We begin the Liturgy of the Word. St. Paul says: "Faith comes from being heard." (Rom 10:17) For many centuries Christians were mostly illiterate, but they received the Scriptures in an orderly fashion as they attended Mass, week after week, year after year (and sometimes day after day). In fact, the early Church defined its Scriptures as those books that could be legitimately read during the Mass – for no other word or document may be proclaimed as "the Word" at Mass. The Old Testament books are the Church's first Scripture. They proclaim the history of our salvation by way of many covenants God made with his people up to the time of Jesus. God revealed the Old Testament as a preparation for the New Testament. The Old contains the New in a hidden way. We can fully understand the Old Testament when we see it through the lens of the Gospel. Notice a brief period of silence come at intervals during the Liturgy of the Word. These are important moments for meditation, when we receive the Word of God into our hearts.

CATECHISM CORNER: HOW TO EAT AN ELEPHANT ONE BITE AT A TIME



Article 282 (CCC): Catechesis on creation is of major importance. It concerns the very foundations of Christian life.

REFLECTION:

Putting aside all theories and meditating on the simple statement "nothing comes from nothing" is one way to begin our catechesis on creation. This leads to the following reflection: why is there something rather than nothing?

SAINT MARIA BERTILLA BOSCARDIN SAINT OF THE DAY FOR FEBRUARY 26 (OCTOBER 6, 1888 – OCTOBER 20, 1922) SAINT MARIA BERTILLA BOSCARDIN'S STORY



Image: Statue of Santa Bertilla | facade of Church of Saints Peter and Paul, Cagnano, Italy | photo by Threecharlie


If anyone knew rejection, ridicule and disappointment, it was today's saint. But such trials only brought Maria Bertilla Boscardin closer to God and more determined to serve him.

Born in Italy in 1888, the young girl lived in fear of her father, a violent man prone to jealousy and drunkenness. Her schooling was limited so that she could spend more time helping at home and working in the fields. She showed few talents and was often the butt of jokes. In 1904, she joined the Sisters of Saint Dorothy and was assigned to work in the kitchen, bakery and laundry. After some

time Maria received nurses' training and began working in a hospital with children suffering from diphtheria. There the young nun seemed to find her true vocation: nursing very ill and disturbed children. Later, when the hospital was taken over by the military in World War I, Sister Maria Bertilla fearlessly cared for patients amidst the threat of constant air raids and bombings. She died in 1922 after suffering for many years from a painful tumor. Some of the patients she had nursed many years before were present at her canonization in 1961.

REFLECTION

This fairly recent saint knew the hardships of living in an abusive situation. Let us pray to her to help all those who are suffering from any form of spiritual, mental, or physical abuse
