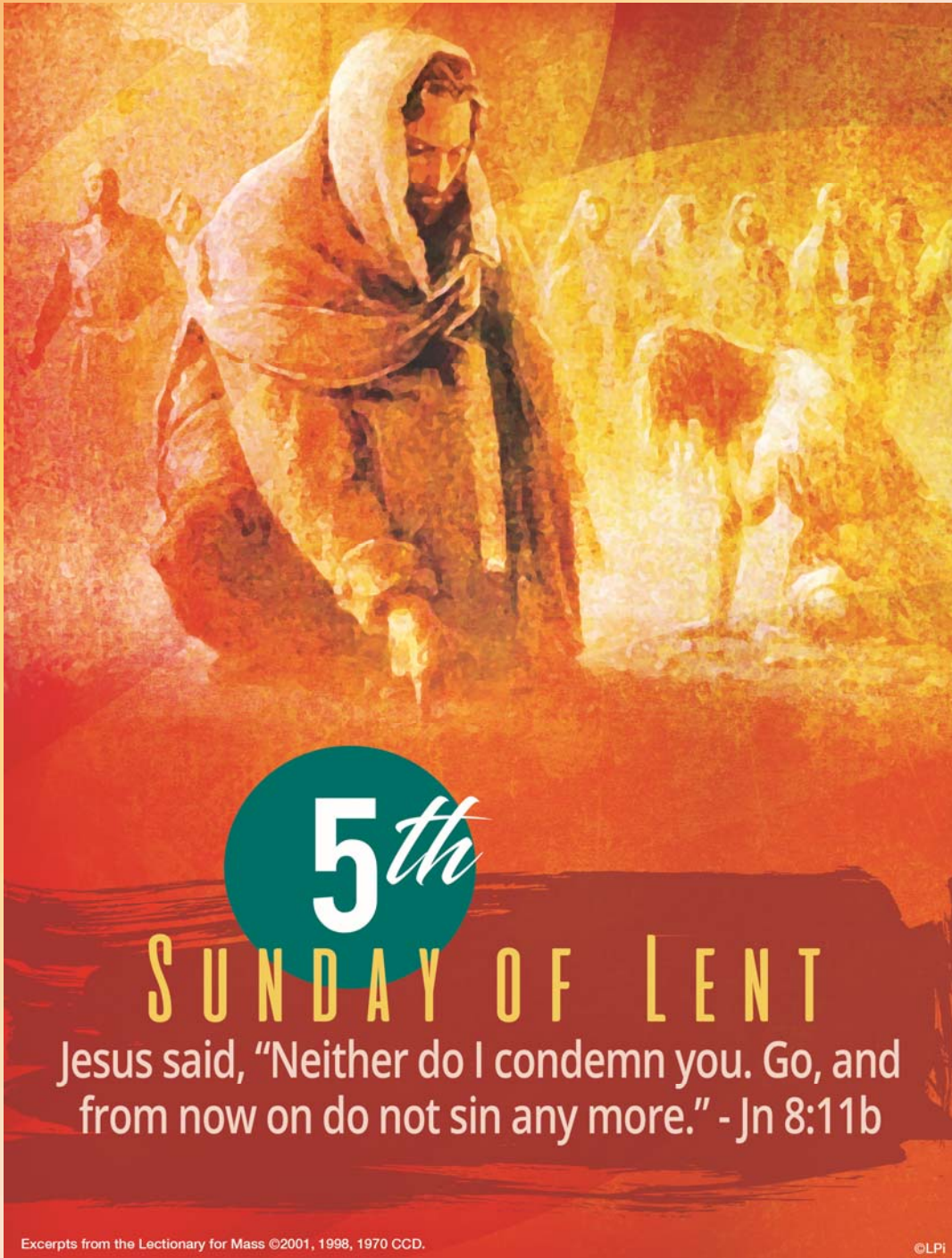

To him/her who wrote the note and to your "bulwark" companions, please know that I keep you in my prayers. When you go to your new parish, may you be faithfully guided there. Amen

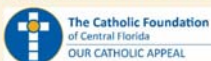

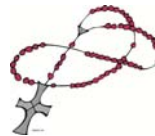

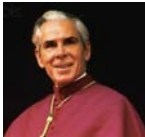

VENERABLE FULTON SHEEN SPEAKS . . .



"The death of our Lord on the Cross reveals what we are meant to be perpetually dissatisfied here below. If earth were meant to be a Paradise, then He who made it would never have taken leave of it on Good Friday. The commending of the Spirit to the Father was at the same time the refusal to commend it to earth. The completion or fulfillment of our life is heaven, not on earth."



LOOK FOR THIS TODAY AT MASS TODAY—
THE PROFESSION OF FAITH.

When we stand up in community and recite the *creed* during Mass, we act in communion with each other and with the whole body of Christ – the Church throughout the world and down through the ages, the saints of the past as well as our current neighbors. No Catholic is an island. No Catholic lives alone in the faith. Even someone who lives on a desert island, even someone who languishes in solitary confinement, if they keep the faith, they live in Christ with the whole Church. We recite the creed as a summary of our faith. One can explain the Apostles Creed if one is asked what do Catholics believe. The Church developed its creeds slowly, deliberately, over the course of centuries. Every word was carefully chosen, tested, contested, debated, and only then confirmed. Christians shed their blood and died in defense of subtle shades of meaning in the words chosen for the creeds. The Church gives us the creed so that we can prepare ourselves to celebrate the Eucharist. In the creed we declare our unity with Christ and the Church. In the Eucharist we consummate unity. What we accept verbally in the creed, we accomplish bodily in Holy Communion. Recently, the phrasing of our translation was changed to make it reflect the historical creeds with greater accuracy. Some of the terms – like *consubstantial* and *incarnate* – are taken from unfamiliar and technical language of theology. But no other words describe the mysteries with such precision. The Father and the Son are *of the same substance*. The Word *took flesh* - became incarnate. Through repeated, prayerful profession over a course of a lifetime, we make such words our own, and we make the faith our own.

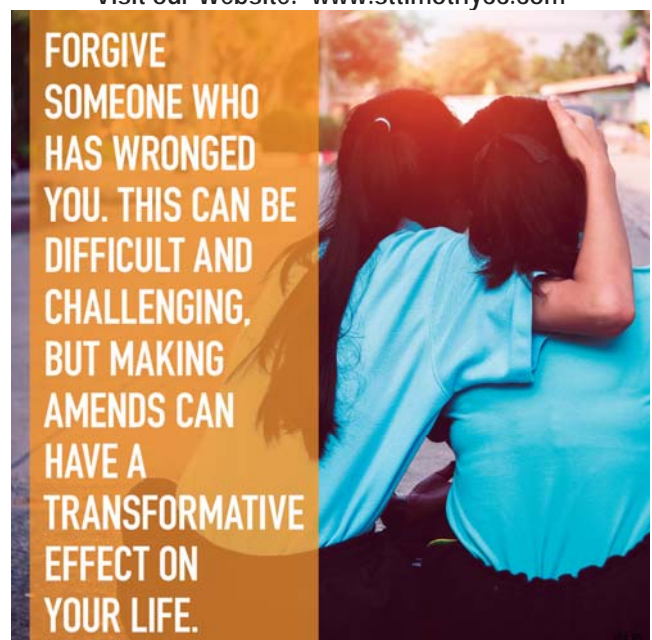
