ORIGINS OF FATHER'S DAY

On July 5, 1908, a West Virginia church sponsored the nation's first event explicitly in honor of fathers, a Sunday sermon in memory of the 362 men who had died in the previous December's explosions at the Fairmont Coal Company mines in Monongah, but it was a one-time commemoration and not an annual holiday.

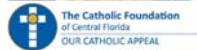
The next year, a Spokane, Washington, woman named Sonora Smart Dodd, one of six children raised by a widower, tried to establish an official equivalent to Mother's Day for male parents. She went to local churches, the YMCA, shopkeepers and government officials to drum up support for her idea, and she was successful: Washington State celebrated the nation's first statewide Father's Day on June 19, 1910.

Slowly, the holiday spread. In 1916, President Wilson honored the day by using telegraph signals to unfurl a flag in Spokane when he pressed a button in Washington, D.C. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge urged state governments to observe Father's Day.

Today, the day honoring fathers is celebrated in the United States on the third Sunday of June.

THE FIRST ELEVATION OF THE HOST AND CHALICE.

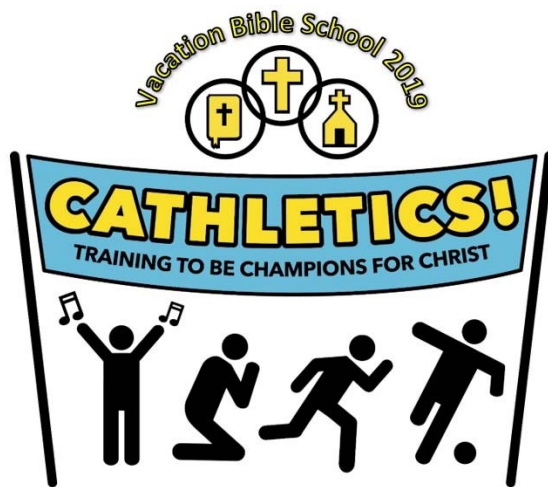
“And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself” (John 12:32). When the priest consecrates the bread, it is no longer bread, though it keeps its appearance of bread. It is indeed the Body of Christ, and the priest raises it up as a perfect offering to the Father. When the priest consecrates the chalice of wine, it no longer holds wine, though the contents of the chalice keep the appearance of wine. The chalice now contains the Blood of Christ. This part of Mass is known as the “major elevation”. At each elevation, first the host, then the chalice, you will see some people bow, others gaze at the elements, and still others whisper prayers under their breath (a favorite is that of the Apostles Thomas: “My Lord and my God” (John 20:28). To know Jesus is to love him. To gaze upon him is to be overwhelmed by that love. Knowing what we know – about his memorial, about his real presence – how can we but adore him? The bells that are rung at many churches during each elevation strikes the ears as a fanfare for this heavenly King, who comes to us so humbly.

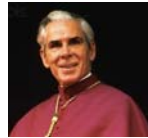

HEALING OUR CHURCH DISCUSSION GROUPS COMING

Come together for six weeks in small groups with fellow parishioners to pray and reflect on the clergy abuse crisis and to envision a path forward as a Roman Catholic family of faith. CATECHISM CORNER: HOW TO EAT AN ELEPHANT  
ONE BITE AT A TIME



Article 1109 (CCC): “The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit” have to remain with us always and bear fruit beyond the eucharistic celebration.

REFLECTION:

The word “mass” comes from a Latin word for “sent”, the idea being that we are sent away to live what we have prayed during the Mass. All that goes on during the liturgy is meant to equip us and strengthens us for all that goes on outside the liturgy.
