

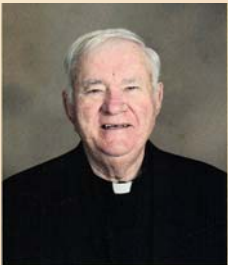

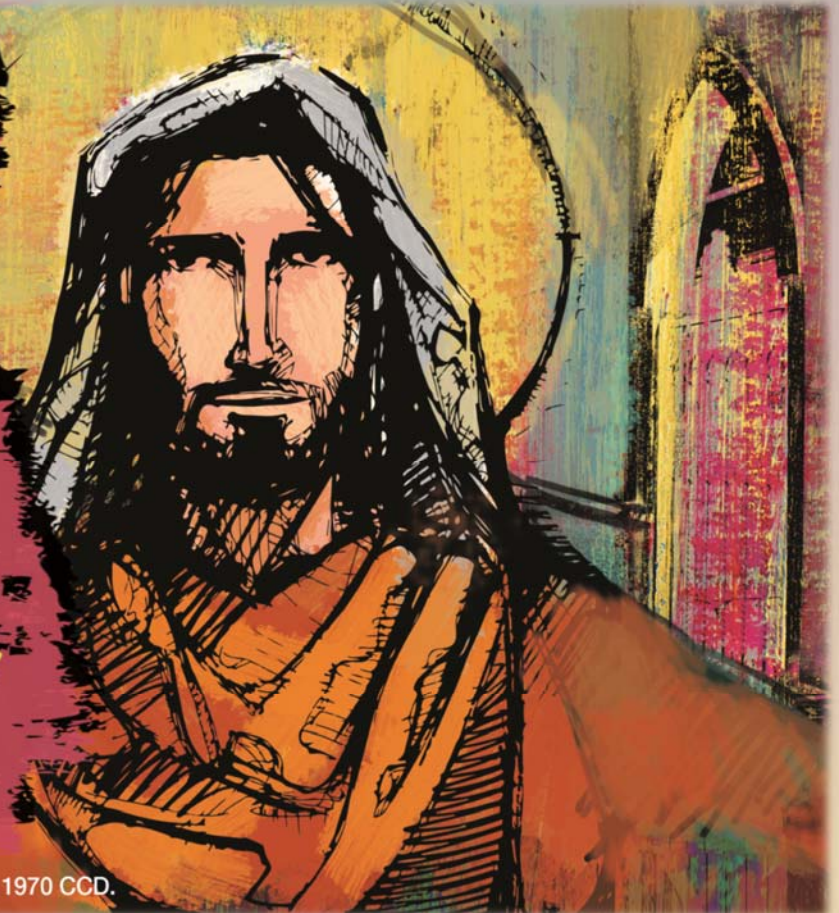
## Happy 80th Birthday Fr. Bob



This Sunday, at 9:00 AM Mass we will celebrate Fr. Bob's 80th Birthday. Following Mass, please join Fr. Bob for coffee and donuts in the hall.

Fr. Robert (Bob) Fuchek became the third pastor of St Timothy on December 1, 1993. The need for a larger facility was apparent and Fr. Bob oversaw the construction from groundbreaking on November 23, 1994 to dedication on Sunday, January 28, 1996. Fr. Bob remained as Pastor of St. Timothy until his retirement in June, 2009. Although retired, he is still an active part of the parish where he celebrates Mass, hears confessions, volunteers at St. Vincent de Paul Society, and occasionally moderates a class for adult faith formation.

LOOK FOR THIS TODAY AT MASS TODAY  
THE SIGN OF PEACE.

"Greet one another with a holy kiss," said St. Paul (Romans 16:16). In fact he must have said it repeatedly...it must have been a commonplace statement of the apostles, because St. Peter also says: "Greet one another with a loving kiss. Peace to all of you who are in Christ." (1Peter: 5:14). So even today, when we meet for Mass, our priests invite us "to offer each other the Sign of Peace." The sign will vary from culture to culture...we should do what is culturally appropriate. St Cyril, like many of the early Christians, makes the connection between this simple gesture and the words of the Lord Jesus: "Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift." (Matthew 5:23-24). This is a crucial moment in the Mass. We have just dared to call God "Our Father." We soon will dare to approach his altar and receive his body and blood as our own. He demands that, before we take another step toward companionship with "our Father", we must make peace with our neighbors. The gesture we make – whatever it may be – must be a sign of a deeper and more pervasive peace in our lives. We are not just declaring our peace with a person who happens to be in the seat next to us. We make a sign that we are at peace with everyone – even those people whom we may count as rivals, opponents, and adversaries...we place a premium on charity; and with charity comes peace. Jesus made such peace a precondition of a truly Holy Communion. Peace also presupposes justice. We cannot honestly say we are at peace with our neighbors if we are not doing what we can to make sure they are getting adequate food, clothing, and shelter. This is only just. God created the goods of the world intending them to be distributed to his creatures. If we are overfed and clothed in finery while others are hungry and cold, then we cannot say we are living just. Some people are reticent about making the Sign of Peace. For those whose immune systems are compromised by illness, medical treatment, or age, a simple handshake could mean greater vulnerability to infection. We should respect their wishes and nod in their direction. We should greet their gesture with our warmest smile. That can be, all the more, a Sign of Peace.

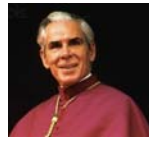

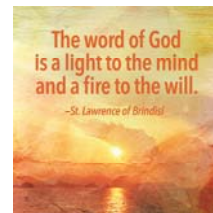
