3-year-old Reese: 'Our Father, Who does art in heaven, Harold is His name. Amen.'

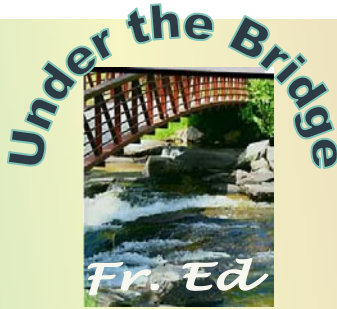
A little boy was overheard praying: 'Lord, if you can't make me a better boy, don't worry about it. I'm having a real good time like I am.'

RECYCLING—THANK YOU



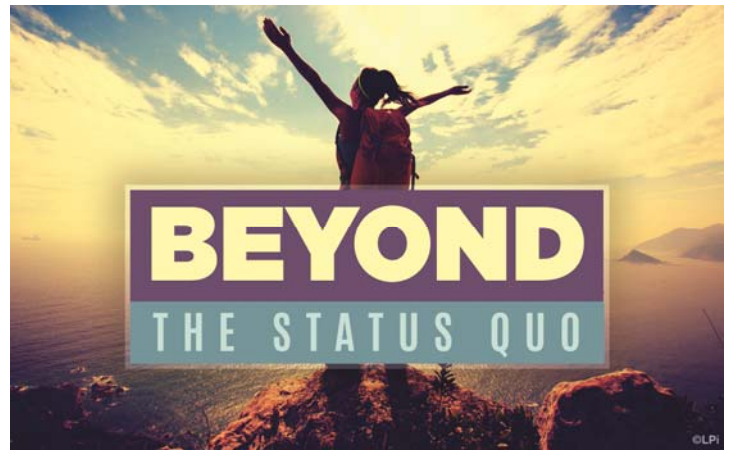
Thanks to all who are recycling newspapers and

LOOK FOR THIS TODAY AT MASS TODAY
THE CLEANSING OF THE VESSELS:

After Communion, there is a bustle of quiet and orderly activity in the sanctuary. If any of the Precious Blood remains in the chalice, the priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers consume it. The priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister will then take water and cleanse the insides of the vessels: the ciboria, patens, chalices, and so on. If a fragment of the host sticks to the priest's fingers, he wipes or washes his fingers over the paten. Meanwhile, he also looks for fragments that may have fallen onto the altar cloths. One receiving the body of Christ in the hands, should look for any remaining fragments on the hand and consume them immediately. These simple, homey actions are a profound witness to Jesus' real presence in the sacrament. If we believe that he is entirely present in every drop and every crumb, then the priest must take special care to consume every drop and every crumb.

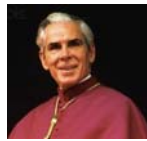


GOSPEL OF JOHN
