Dear Sacred Heart Family,

Thank you to all who helped with the planning and execution of our 260<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Year opening picnic last weekend, especially to Isabel Williams who was the picnic chairwoman. It was a wonderful way to open our anniversary year. Thank you to all who braved the heat to celebrate!

Today we celebrate Father's Day, and I would like to share a few words from Pope Francis to all fathers:

*"I ask for you the grace to be ever closer to your children, allow them to grow, but be close, close! They need you, your presence, your closeness, your love. May you be for them as St Joseph was [to Jesus]: guardians of their growth in age, wisdom and grace. May you guard them on their journey: be educators and walk with them. And by this closeness you will be true educators. Thank you for all you do for your children: thank you."*

This quote is very striking if we look at the relationship St. Pope John Paul II (Karol Wojtyla) had with his own father. A book about the saint's life described the relationship this way:

*"[Karol Wojtyla's father] was a very attentive, generous and selfless man, and he knew how to adapt to the needs of his son. Although he talked about history and literature, he also talked about sports, music and entertainment. Often father and son would go to the movies together, which Karol particularly enjoyed. On Sunday, they would eat lunch together in a restaurant and take a long walk along the Skawa River. They also played together...[Karol's father] was an incomparable mentor of spiritual life for his son. Karol's schoolmates state that they would often see the two Wojtylas kneeling next to one another in the church, engrossed in prayer. It was a moving sight."*

St. Pope John Paul II himself had this to say about his father: *"The mere fact of seeing him on his knees had a decisive influence on my early years. He was so hard on himself that he had no need to be hard on his son; his example alone was sufficient to inculcate discipline and a sense of duty. He was an exceptional person."*

We can see what a powerful influence fathers have in the lives of their children. Father's Day is a time to remember our fathers, whether living or deceased, by praying for them to the Father of us all, our Father in heaven, that he may strengthen them in their duty as Christian fathers and give those who are no longer with us the reward of eternal life.

This weekend we also joyfully celebrate the ordination of nine new priests in the Archdiocese of Washington, who were all ordained on June 20<sup>th</sup> in Washington, DC. Among those ordained was Fr. Conrad Murphy, who was a seminarian here at Holy Angels in 2010. We give thanks to God for inspiring these men to answer the call to serve the Lord by offering themselves for his Church.

Today, then, we pray that men everywhere, but especially in our own community, be given the grace to reveal and relive on earth the very fatherhood of God.
