In other news, Last Sunday, Cardinal Wuerl celebrated a Jubilarian Mass for over 900 couples from across the Archdiocese who were celebrating anniversaries of marriages ranging from 25 all the way to 75 years. Of the 917 couples who registered to have their anniversary milestone recognized, over 500 of them were celebrating 50 or more years, and 18 were celebrating over 70 years! What a wonderful witness in our day and age that a life-long commitment is possible!

While many in our society and community and family experience broken homes, this does not mean that marriage itself is impossible. It does mean that as a covenant between a man and a woman it requires everything from us, and it requires us to actively seek God's help every day. When marriage is a sacrament (that is, the giving of a baptized man and a baptized woman to each other in front of God and his Church), spouses no longer love each other with their own love, they love each other with the divine love of Jesus Christ. Each spouse becomes the channel of God's own love for the other. Amazing! And it is through that love that one major purpose of marriage is accomplished – getting our spouse to heaven. Human love alone cannot do it – but with God's love all things are possible. And strengthened by the Eucharist every week, how powerful God's love can be!

The Good News is that Jesus also helps us when we fall. He never, ever gives up on us! And no matter our past, our Lord always traces a path out for us. Perhaps the Lord is inviting you or a loved one to rediscover the greatness of the vocation of marriage by completing your journey towards a sacramental marriage. If so, don't be afraid to say "yes"!
