Dear Sacred Heart Family,

Thank you to all who worked so hard to make our Fall Dinner last Sunday such a success! This does not happen by accident – it takes the hard work of so many of you. Thank you to those who picked and washed the kale, cooked the 70+ turkey breasts, crumbled loaves and loaves of bread for the dressing, folded over 1000 boxes for the cake table and carry-outs, stuffed over 40 hams and cooked and cooled them, sliced the turkey and the hams, packaged over 900 ziploc bags of stuffed ham, over 900 ziploc bags of turkey breast, over 900 bags of rolls for the carry-outs, peeled and eyed pounds and pounds of white and sweet potatoes, cooked them, sliced loads of cabbage, mixed the cole slaw, packaged over 900 containers of dressing, over 900 containers of sweet potatoes, over 900 containers of white potatoes, baked cakes, contacted everyone in the parish to bake cakes, washed all the dishes used for the above, washed all the utensils and trays needed for Sunday, set up the buffet table, set up the plates and silverware for the dining room, cooked the green beans and packaged over 900 containers of green beans, fried the 120+ gallons of oysters, seated people in the dining room, set up the country store, manned the inside cake table, manned the outside cake table, parked the cars, waited on over 500 people in the dining room, transferred the food from the kitchen to the dining room, packaged over 900 carry-out dinners (each with fried oysters and individual packages of stuffed ham, turkey breast, rolls, green beans, dressing, sweet potatoes, white potatoes, gravy, and cole slaw), washed the dishes, safeguarded the money, sold raffle tickets, counted the money, and came back again on Monday to set the hall straight. Thank you once again for your love and dedication to the Lord and our parish!

This week as we enter the month of November, our thoughts turn towards the end of time. On November 1<sup>st</sup>, we celebrate All Saints' Day (a Holy Day of Obligation) as we rejoice with our brothers and sisters who cooperated so well with God's grace that they are now saints. On November 2<sup>nd</sup>, we celebrate All Souls' Day as we pray for our brothers and sisters who are still in need of being perfected by God's grace before they can enter heaven and become saints. On November 10<sup>th</sup>, there will be a special Mass at Sacred Heart at 6:30pm to pray for the deceased from both Holy Angels and Sacred Heart parishes who have passed in the last year, and all others who have been buried at Sacred Heart

Cemetery since last November. On November 26<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate the last Sunday in Ordinary Time – the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, and recall that He will come again at the end of time.

These special occasions in November help each of us recall what the Church calls the Four Last Things – death, judgment, heaven and hell. The world as we experience it will pass away, and Jesus will return to establish His kingdom over a new heaven and a new earth. Each of our lives on this earth will also end some day and we will be judged by the Lord. Based upon our choices in this life, we will either have chosen eternal happiness with our Father in heaven as saints or eternal separation from Him in hell. While many of us choose the Lord imperfectly through our actions, there is still hope for us. A final purification in purgatory is provided for us by our Father to transform us into the saints He created us to be. Souls in this state of purification can really be helped by us on earth through our prayers, our sacrifices and having Masses celebrated for them.

I pray that we use this month to reflect on what is most important in life – life with God in eternal happiness as one of His saints, and to dedicate ourselves to praying for any soul in Purgatory, especially those who have no one to pray for them.
