Dear Parish Family,

This weekend we celebrate Memorial Day, a time to remember those who have gone before us and especially those who have sacrificed their lives for our freedom. This remembrance will be marked by special ceremonies and parades in most places; special masses will be held at parishes and at our Catholic cemeteries; and perhaps some will gather with family and friends and share fond memories of loved ones and perhaps visit the graves of those who have passed away.



The origin of Memorial Day, as it is known today, was more than 150 years ago in May of 1858, three years after the Civil War ended. It was originally called Decoration Day because it was a day for Americans to remember family members and friends who had fallen in the war and to adorn their graves with springtime flowers. After World War I the commemoration was expanded to honor everyone in the nation who had perished as a result of any American war. In 1971 an act of Congress officially declared it to be a national holiday.

In a spirit of gratitude for the opportunity to live in freedom and for our gift of faith, we need to devote time to educate the youth and future generations of the sacrifices made in the past and to understand what might be required in the future when freedom is threatened. Memorial Day is more than another day off from work or school, more than an opportunity to gather candy thrown from the local parade, and more than an extra day to work in our gardens. We must be conscious that all of life is a gift—and ultimately we give thanks to God for our faith and freedom, which throughout history has been worth the ultimate sacrifice of so many lives.

Here in our parish we will recall and pray for those who have died at a special 9:00 a.m. Mass, with a memorial tribute in the piazza following Mass to honor those from the Little Italy neighborhood who have served in the military and sacrificed their lives in past wars.

Perhaps while you are enjoying a family gathering or a backyard barbecue on Monday, you may also observe a moment of silence at 3:00 p.m. to remember and honor those who have died in service to our nation. Our freedom should not be taken for granted, and so our government established *The National Moment of Remembrance* in the year 2000 to ensure that the often unknown heroes of the past who sacrificed their lives for future generations would not be forgotten. Perhaps we may go one step further to also fall on our knees in prayer and thanksgiving to our loving God, the provider of life and all good gifts.

Ottawa Archbishop Terrence Prendergast has issued a statement in response to Catholic Liberal leader Justin Trudeau’s new policy that only ‘pro-choice’ candidates will be endorsed to run as candidates in his party. It is a more extreme position than any other Liberal leader has taken on this issue, on which MPs have been traditionally been free to vote their conscience.

Entitled, “Being in Communion with the Catholic Church on Moral Issues,” the Archbishop’s letter says, “One may not dissent from these core teachings on life issues and be considered a Catholic in good standing.”

"The position of the Catholic Church in favor of life at all stages is clear and unchanging,” writes the archbishop. “A person who takes a position in contradiction to the teaching of the Catholic Church on the value and dignity of human life from the moment of conception to the moment of a natural death, and persists in this belief, is not in communion with the Church’s values and teaching, which we believe faithfully transmit for today the teachings of Christ.”

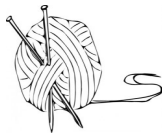
Feast of the Assumption
