My Dear Parish Family:

In the RCIA process, many adults who come to us are often undergraduate or graduate students or men and women whose work may take them to other cities. As we complete the process, our neophytes are reminded that wherever they go, Holy Rosary will always be their home. They may encounter a parish that does not have the skilled and talented musicians that enrich our liturgy, the charismatic homilist, or the hospitality of coffee and donuts on Sunday mornings. But what is most important for them (and for all of us) is the encounter experienced with Jesus Christ at every Mass. By the virtue of his ordination, the priest, acting in the person of Christ, brings heaven to earth. He asks God that the bread and wine may become Christ for the salvation of all who will receive Him. The priest recalls our Lord's passion, death and resurrection and repeats Jesus' words at the Last Supper as He offered the sacrifice of His own Body and Blood.

Today, we celebrate this miraculous gift of the Holy Eucharist, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Here at Holy Rosary, and most surrounding parishes in our diocese, we are blessed for the opportunity to receive the Eucharist daily at Mass. Other nations, where people suffer persecution because of their belief in Jesus Christ, are not as fortunate. In our own country, in many areas priests are few in number and liturgies are shared among parishes. May we never take for granted what the Lord has given us: His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity for our eternal salvation.

Great saints have professed their faith in the real presence of Jesus within the consecrated Host. They loved to be in the presence of the Most Holy Sacrament. The saints knew that it is impossible to find on earth a more precious treasure worthy of our love than Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament (St. Alphonsus Liguori). St. Francis of Assisi wrote in one of his letters, *"Everything in man should halt in awe. Let all the world quake and let Heaven exult when Christ the Son of the living God is there on the altar in the hands of the priest."* Following her conversion to the Catholic Faith, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton said, *"God is everywhere, in the very air I breathe – yes, everywhere, but in His Sacrament of the altar He is as present actually and really as my soul within my body; in His Sacrifice daily offered as really as once offered on the cross."*

How can you and I not be in awe of all that we have received from the Lord? How can we receive Him but with the purest of hearts and minds...in sincerity and humility. How can we not reverence Him as we enter His house, receive Him with the greatest of respect? He rests in the Tabernacle, day after day. To come and spend precious moments with Him, to adore and give praise is time that will enhance our lives in ways that one cannot imagine. This weekend, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the altar for us to come, pray, adore, and praise our Lord. Come, spend just one hour with our Lord and pray for our brothers and sisters who are prohibited to express their love and desire for the Eucharist. Come and pray for all that is in *your* heart. Our Neophytes have been given a great example here at Holy Rosary. May they now give witness to those who do not yet know the Lord.

Culture of Life at Holy Rosary Parish

The Gospel of Life

“...the temptation grows to have recourse to *euthanasia*, that is, to *take control of death and bring it about before its time*, “gently” ending one’s own life or the life of others. In reality, what might seem logical and humane, when looked at more closely is seen to be *senseless and inhumane*. Here we are faced with one of the more alarming symptoms of the “culture of death”, which is advancing above all **in prosperous societies**, marked by an attitude of excessive preoccupation with efficiency and which **sees the growing number of elderly and disabled people as intolerable and too burdensome**. These people are very often isolated by their families and by society, which are organized almost exclusively on the basis of criteria of productive efficiency, according to which **a hopelessly impaired life no longer has any value.**” *Evangelium Vitae*

...in the World

On June 5th, Quebec’s legislature became the first in Canada, by a vote of 94-22, to pass a bill legalizing euthanasia. The measure makes it legal for a physician, who has been given consent by a patient, to administer a lethal injection for the purpose of causing the patient’s death. Since euthanasia is officially illegal in Canada as a whole, Bill 52 uses the term “medical aid in dying,” language that has been called “vague and disingenuous.” It is a possibility that the federal government will challenge the law in court.
