My Dear Parish Family:

I recently saw a movie entitled, “*The Rape of Europa*,” which was a documentary on how the Nazis systematically stole countless works of art from each of the countries they occupied during World War II. There was one story contained in this movie that provided a helpful insight on how to celebrate the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul today.

By the time the Nazis invaded Poland in 1939, the people of Cracow were aware of the Nazi’s practice of commandeering works of art. They took action to hide their most precious item which was a spectacular scene of the Last Supper that adorned the altar of the St. Mary Church. It was created in the 15th Century by Veit Stoss. This life-size piece included extremely life-like and expressive faces on each of the saints. The remarkable thing about this piece is that the artist used as the models for these faces the local residents of Cracow. Imagine the reaction of the town’s people when they first viewed this piece – there was St. Peter with the face of the local butcher while St. John had the face of your neighbor’s teenage son! If this happened at Holy Rosary, you would be looking at your favorite usher in the face of St. Matthew or see today’s Lector when you gaze into the face of St. Nathaniel. What an inspired stroke of genius.

We venerate the saints as our models of holiness, of how one can courageously live the gospel and proclaim the gospel as did Peter and Paul. We are successful in this effort to the extent we can “see ourselves” in the saints. By rendering the saints as “ordinary” people in his masterpiece, the artist helped the locals to see themselves as saints. One can only speculate what an impact that must have had on the people of Cracow. I have to wonder what one of Poland’s bishops, Karol Wojtyla, thought when he gazed upon this work. Did he see his own face in that of St. Peter?

St. Peter is the rock on which Christ set His Church and St. Paul was the voice of the Gospel to the Gentiles. Through their intercession may we see *ourselves* as today’s saints-in-the-making ready to do whatever it takes to build the Kingdom of God.

“A unique responsibility belongs to health-care personnel: doctors, pharmacists, nurses, chaplains, men and women religious, administrators and volunteers. Their profession calls for them to be guardians and servants of human life. In today’s cultural and social context, in which science and the practice of medicine risk losing sight of their inherent ethical dimension, health-care professionals can be strongly tempted at times to become manipulators of life, **or even agents of death.**”

Read this one carefully!!

“Medical staff in Great Britain are now legally obliged to **consult** with patients if they wish to put a Do Not Resuscitate (DNR) order on their notes, the Court of Appeal in England has ruled in a landmark judgement. The court declared that the hospital trust ‘violated (the) Article 8 right (under the European Convention of Human Rights) to respect for private life in failing to involve (the patient) in the process which first led to the notice’ ...since a (DNR) decision is one which will potentially deprive the patient of life-saving treatment, there should be a presumption in favor of patient involvement.”

Please notice that the issue is **NOT** whether the patient **consents**, but whether a patient must even be **informed** that the hospital has decided not to offer resuscitation.

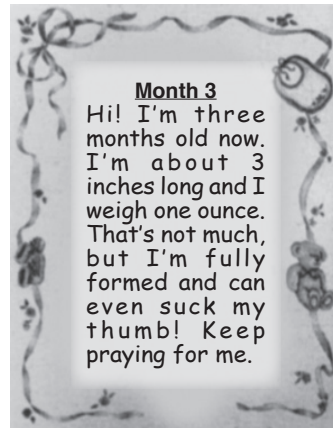
A Reminder

14th Annual Catholic Family FESTival

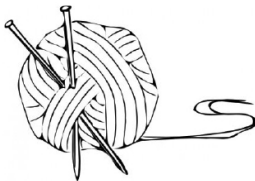
