My Dear Parish Family:

In this week's letter to the Romans, Saint Paul speaks of the wonder and glory of God. No one can measure God's wealth, wisdom and knowledge, nor can we explain or understand His decisions. Saint Paul affirms that no one has ever known the Lord's thoughts or given Him advice. Everything comes from the Lord...all things come from Him, because of Him and will one day return to Him.

Paul's letter brings us to our Gospel where Jesus is asking His followers who did people say He was. None of the disciples really knew – none except Simon Peter. He responded "*You are the Christ.*" Peter says that Jesus *is* the Messiah, the "*Son of the living God.*"

On Tuesday evening, September 9, 2014, the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) will formally resume at Holy Rosary. Inquirers will come not really knowing what to expect. Some come from other Christian churches and have an extensive religious background. Others come who have no formal religion, and yet often unknown to them, the Spirit of God is actively drawing them....tugging at their heart telling them that there is much more ahead of them if they choose to follow the Lord. What they all bring with them is a hunger for truth and substance. Peter was given the keys that would open the doors to truth and wisdom. This is what they will come to know and we pray, believe.

For an inquirer this is a major transition. Like the apostles who responded to the call of Jesus "Follow me," (Mt 4:18-22) those who walk through the Adult Ed Room for the first time are taking their first step toward a life of faith. The apostles left everything (Lk 5:11) to follow Christ. For the inquirer, the *stuff* offered by the secular world can become obstacles that must be addressed through the knowledge of God our Father, guidance from the Holy Spirit and establishing an authentic relationship with Jesus Christ.

Upon hearing Simon Peter's response, Jesus called him "*Peter*" (meaning rock in Greek) and said that upon this rock He (Jesus) would build His Church. It is in this gift you and I have that gives the inquirers the substance of which they were searching. It is in this gift that brings to life all that we believe to be true.

Who do you say Jesus is? What place does He have in your life? These questions will be asked of our inquirers. Perhaps we can spend some quality time with our Lord, and ask ourselves "who do *I* say Jesus is?" "Where does he *fit* in my life?"

Please pray for those who have the courage to take that first step to come and see, and for our parish that our witness may be faith-filled and genuine as we live the way of Christ through His Church.

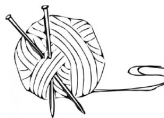
