Dear Parish Family,

Last week, we heard from Father Baugh regarding the *40 Days for Life* campaign, which began this past week. Talking about the sanctity of life can, at times, be a difficult task and one in which we are not completely comfortable. It is, however, imperative that we do so. Our Lord commanded that we preach the whole truth of the Gospel He gave to the Apostles and which they have handed down to us.

That said, this particular teaching is not limited simply to explaining the intrinsic evil of abortion; rather, it is all-encompassing, speaking to the beauty and sacredness of all human life created in the image and likeness of God. It is only in this context that we begin to understand the precious gift from God that is human life – in every stage from natural conception to natural death.

There is much more we can say about the sanctity of human life. Pope St. John Paul II wrote extensively about this in his encyclical *Evangelium Vitae (The Gospel of Life)*. The late Holy Father understood the importance of developing a “Culture of Life” in society that would be the impetus for the conversion of hearts. St. John Paul II “also understood the need for healing and mercy for those impacted by the culture of death – which really includes all of us.

As a pastoral response to those needs, Holy Rosary will sponsor an afternoon of prayer and healing for those in any way affected by abortion on Sunday afternoon, October 12, beginning at 1:00 p.m. We are grateful that Bishop Roger Gries will be with us to provide words of healing, comfort, and peace. Several priests will be in attendance to hear Confessions. This is an opportunity for us as a parish to assist in the conversion of hearts back to the Lord. The heart of the Gospel is mercy, as Jesus came to redeem us, not condemn us.

We invite you to participate and invite others to do so as well. Through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Mercy, let us continue the work of preaching the whole Gospel.
