My Dear Parish Family,

The third of “*The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic,*” is *generosity*. If prayer and study were the most important and fundamental of the four signs, generosity is the most visible. You will recall that the research revealed that less than 7% of the Catholic population is responsible for over 80% of the volunteer hours and over 80% of the financial support received. The generosity that marks these disciples is born from a spirit of gratitude; from the recognition that all things are gifts from God. God holds the role of owner and our role is that of steward. With a steward’s heart the engaged Catholic finds it easier to be generous not only with their monetary treasures but also with their praise, their encouragement, their love, their time and their talents. The following is a true story taken from an interview conducted by one of the researchers.

Sally, a single nurse at a local hospital, was designated by her pastor to be one of the most generous, engaged members of her parish, so she was interviewed by the Research Team. After the formalities of introduction, she insisted that they had the wrong person and that they should be interviewing her friend Joan, because she was far more generous. When asked why, she told her story. A while back Sally was diagnosed with breast cancer. Immediately she began to undergo aggressive treatment which caused her to miss work. She still had a long road to recovery when her vacation and short-term disability ran out and with it her income. Joan stepped in and took two of Sally’s shifts each week with the condition that Sally would receive the pay. Joan also organized the other nurses on the floor to cover all of Sally’s other shifts each week with the same condition. Needless to say, the interviewer was utterly amazed at the generosity that Joan and the others extended to Sally. As an afterthought, the interviewer asked Sally, “How long did Joan and the others provide you this generous support?” With tears in her eyes she responded, “Five years.”

When dealing out graces and blessings, our God is always abundantly generous. The feeding of the 5,000 and the parable of the lost sheep illustrate God’s disproportionate generosity toward us. Joan’s generosity was extreme in its likeness to that of our Lord’s. We would do well to imitate this most visible sign of our faith. In closing, I would like to leave you with a quote from Bishop Fulton J. Sheen: “*Never measure your generosity by what you give, but rather by what your have left.*” This should leave you with something to think about.

I will conclude this series next time with the fourth sign of engaged Catholics, *evangelization*.

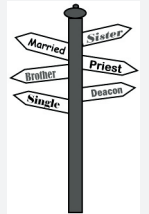
