My Dear Parish Family,

In Matthew's Gospel we again witness Jesus being challenged by the Jewish leaders on matters of the "Law." A scribe, an expert in the law, asked Jesus which of the laws was greater than the others. Jesus' response was in accord with that of His challengers: *to love God with all your heart, all your soul and with all your mind, and to love one's neighbor as oneself*. The first commandment that Jesus quoted was *Deuteronomy 6:5* (verse that is part of the *Shema*, the basic creed of Judaism with which every Jewish service still opens and means that human beings must give God their total love). The second commandment that Jesus quoted originates from *Leviticus 19:18* (love for God must result in love for one another). The love for one another is deeply grounded in the love of God. The difference between Jesus and His opponents was that the Pharisees only speculated about the law where Jesus fulfilled this law of love in His words *and* deeds.

The media depicts love as an "*in the moment*" feeling that can dissipate at someone's whim without any consequence. The secular world has stripped *love* of its true gift...to dedicate oneself to another, unselfishly and sacrificially. God does that for us every moment of our lives; He sacrificed His only Son, Jesus Christ for our eternal salvation. For us to love God means to place Him first in our lives, respecting His name and keeping holy His day. We dedicate our entire person to His will. Can we give Him any less? Loving our neighbor means to respect others, their relationships, their reputations and their property. Love of neighbor knows no boundaries. It extends even to strangers, especially the poor, the sick and the sinner. God has no boundaries for those to whom He gives His love. Can we be any less? Saint Paul, in the second reading, gives thanks to God for His disciples and their ability, through the Holy Spirit, to convert the Thessalonians. It seems very appropriate that today we celebrate "*Priesthood Sunday*," a day set aside to honor those disciples who have answered God's call to the priesthood. It is a day to reflect upon and affirm the role of the priest in the life of the Church. A priest submits himself completely to God and to the people to whom He serves. He *is* living the Great Commandment. Can you imagine not having a priest available to celebrate the Mass or absolve our sins in the sacrament of Reconciliation on a regular basis? There are areas in our own country that experience just that. People travel for miles to receive what we have been blessed with every day. Please pray for men to hear and respond to God's call. Pray, too, for all priests, especially our pastor, Father Joe, and for Father Mani, that they always know God's love and persevere in His mission; may they live His law of love in the Gospel they proclaim and in their service to all people, and may they do so with peace and joy in their hearts.
