Dear Parish Family,

On this 3rd Sunday of Easter our gospel recounts another post-resurrection appearance of Jesus to the disciples on that first Easter Day. Again, the disciples first react with fear upon seeing the Risen Lord and Jesus has to calm their anxieties, eating something in front of them to assure them that He is real and alive in their midst. Jesus continues to open the disciples' hearts and minds to understanding His whole purpose for becoming a human person – that all written in the prophets would be fulfilled in His suffering, death and resurrection.

Jesus tells the disciples that they “are witnesses of these things” through which the Lord reconciles humanity back to God. As witnesses they are called to preach the forgiveness of sins through Jesus' name throughout the world. This past week, our Holy Father Pope Francis has continued this witness in his Petrine ministry by announcing a year of Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy beginning December 8, 2015, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. On this day, the Holy Father will open the Holy Door which he intends to be a “*Door of Mercy* through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God who consoles, pardons, and instills hope.”

The Pope has proclaimed *Merciful like the Father*, as the “motto” of this Holy Year in which each Particular Church is called to participate in special ways throughout the liturgical year. As we prepare to enter this year of Jubilee, we can reflect more deeply upon the experience of the Lord's mercy in our individual lives as a measure to how well we are living this each day. As Pope Francis states:

It is my burning desire that, during this Jubilee, the Christian people may reflect on the *corporal and spiritual works of mercy*. It will be a way to reawaken our conscience, too often grown dull in the face of poverty. And let us enter more deeply into the heart of the Gospel where the poor have a special experience of God's mercy. Jesus introduces us to these works of mercy in his preaching so that we can know whether or not we are living as his disciples. Let us rediscover these *corporal works of mercy*: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead. And let us not forget the *spiritual works of mercy*: to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill, and pray for the living and the dead.

We really do not need to wait until December to awaken the impact of the Lord's mercy on us. We can begin now as we rejoice in His resurrection during this Easter Season. Let us continuously keep our hearts open to the workings of the Holy Spirit within us, to quell our anxieties and assure us that the Risen Lord is real and in our midst.

The Fair Trade Sale is a special opportunity to practice charity, solidarity, and a preferential option for the poor. At 10:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m., there will also be a 15-minute presentation about this year's trips to Nicaragua and the Appalachian Mountains for those of you who would

like to learn more about the students' experiences.

Today, over 2 billion people live on less than \$2.00 per day, and millions of small-scale producers around the world have been plunged into poverty by international market forces over which they have no control. Pope John Paul II reminds us, "the primary basis of the value of work is man himself," not the items he or she produces.

But how can we be sure that the farmer has been paid a fair wage? That slave labor and child labor have not contributed to the low prices we enjoy? The answer is that unless we know where the coffee, tea, and cocoa come from, we can't be sure.

Fair Trade products guarantee prices that enable producers to cover their costs and provide a very modest yet decent standard of living for their families. By purchasing fairly traded foods and handcrafts, we are making a conscious choice to buy from poor people in a way that promises to help lift them out of poverty.

We will have purses our students brought back from Nicaragua, Fair Trade chocolate, coffee and tea, and a selection of fairly traded jewelry, zippered bags, and scarves. **Please be generous! Proceeds benefit Catholic Relief Services and the Newman Campus Ministry Social Justice and Retreat Scholarship Fund.**
