My Dear Parish Family:

Have you ever looked up at the sky when there were only a few clouds situated in such a manner that you could imagine Jesus actually ascending – leaving this earthly world and entering the presence of his Father? On this Feast of the Ascension, today's first reading gives us just such an account. The apostles looking intently at the sky witnessed Jesus "*lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight.*" (Acts 1:1-9) There is no map that can pinpoint heaven's exact location; its reality is beyond our realm of understanding.

Have you ever wondered what it was like to walk with Jesus, sit at his feet and listen to him teach. Actually, we can live closer to Jesus now than the first disciples. It is in the coming of the Holy Spirit that empowered the apostles to attest to all they experienced while living *with* Jesus. Because of his ascent to the Father and the coming of the Holy Spirit, we have been gifted with now *living* in him.

Saint Paul's letter to the Ephesians reinforces all that was presented to our three neophytes last September and throughout the past eight months of RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults). Matthew Schlotter, Elene Zeltner, and Jennie Vaccarello were on a pilgrimage to find God in a new way. They came so they could understand the mystery to which God had called them. They prayed, discerned, and shared their innermost thoughts and concerns. They built a relationship with Jesus, sharing His Cross with their own. They came to believe (and understand) that the Cross was not then and is not now, a symbol of humiliation, but the instrument from which we received the gift of redemption.

Saint Mark writes in his Gospel, "*Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature.*" (Mk 16: 15) The apostles traveled everywhere preaching and converting and the "*Lord worked with them.*" (Mk 16:20) The challenge for our neophytes (and for us all) is to continue the pilgrimage, but now it is they (and us) who must bring God in a new way to a world desperately in need of knowing Him as loving, merciful and just. We don't have to do great things to give witness of God's greatness. Our witness is in following His commandments, the Beatitudes, and living our lives each day reflecting His love, mercy and justice for all people. We don't have to look to the sky for Jesus; we are forever one with Him.

Please remember in prayer those who have strayed from this wonderful gift of the Church and the sacraments that we have been given, and for those who are seeking to know God that their hearts will open to His Spirit and hear His call.
